12. Describe the nature and extent of your experience as a practicing attorney in the trial and appellate courts, and explain how such experience demonstrates the quality of your legal work.

I have sixteen years experience with civil, domestic, and criminal matters. I began my legal career as a federal law clerk. That experience honed my research and writing skills and provided me experience with many complex civil litigation matters and criminal pretrial matters.

My skills were expanded during my clerkship at the Sixteenth Judicial Circuit Court. In that role I learned the breadth and scope of civil, domestic and criminal matters. My clerkship with Judge Moorhouse had a profound impact on my career. I learned about all phases of litigation through observing and assisting in all aspects of a case from discovery disputes, dispositive motions, extraordinary remedies, jury instructions, and post-trial matters.

The variety of my cases has presented me the opportunity for extensive experience in associate and circuit court. I have worked at a medium sized firm, small firms, and have been a solo practitioner for the last seven years.

As an associate at Swanson Midgley, P.C., my work was 60% civil and 40% domestic. With more than 30 attorneys at the firm, I worked with several partners on many diverse areas including contract disputes between individuals and business owners, tortious interference with business relations, personal injury claims, contested probate matters, petitions on account, landlord tenant disputes, mechanics liens, and corporate matters. In the majority of my domestic cases I served as lead counsel. I learned to handle multiple and varied matters, manage my time, identify the relevant issues, and effectively relate to and represent my clients.

At Campbell & Simpkins, LLC, I continued to handle my own domestic cases, expanded my Guardian ad Litem work, became a trained domestic mediator, and increased my responsibilities and caseload. I also represented defendants on various criminal and

traffic matters before the associate divisions and continued to handle various civil matters in associate and circuit court.

For the last seven years, I have been a solo practitioner. I have no "typical" clients. My clients are as diverse in their socio-economic backgrounds as they are in the remedies they seek. I have represented individuals in petition on account cases, landlord tenant cases, breach of contract cases, driver's license revocation cases, felony DUIs, and felony drug possession matters. In addition, I represented a physician in a professional credentialing matter and before the Missouri Board of Healing Arts. For more than three years, I served as local counsel for a national bank and regularly appeared on the collections docket in which I handled more than 200 cases. I have also disposed of hundreds of domestic cases including more than 200 orders of protection. Of my domestic cases, nearly 250 have been contested matters, numerous resulting in multiple day trials.

Although my appellate practice has been limited to domestic matters, it has been diverse in the issues presented. With these matters I have gained experience in the Western District, Eastern District, and Supreme Court.

It is through my solo practice that I have learned to organize and manage a heavy caseload, obtain discovery with very limited resources, and to effectively and efficiently dispose of cases. Most significantly, my practice reminds me daily of the importance of being kind, courteous, and civil to my clients, as well as, the opposing counsel or party.

Approximately 25% of my cases are Guardian ad Litem cases, many are handled on a *pro bono* basis. I serve as Guardian ad Litem in Jackson, Cass, Clay, and Johnson County, Missouri. I have also been appointed in several cases with many proceedings pending in multiple courts, including criminal proceedings, guardianship proceedings, juvenile court proceedings, and *de novo* review of a substantiated child abuse and neglect proceedings. The opportunity to improve a child's life and to attempt to keep parents focused on the child's best interests constantly reminds me of the important impact of the law.

I believe the quality of my work is reflected in the referrals I receive from former clients, lawyers (including current and former opposing counsel) and members of the judiciary. In addition, I believe a measure of the quality of my work is demonstrated by colleagues requesting me to serve as Guardian ad Litem or mediator on numerous cases. I am humbled when a colleague recommends me to a family member, fellow church member, neighbor, or close friend. On several occasions I have represented three generations in a family, as well as, various siblings within the extended family.

In re: The Marriage of Baldwin, Case No. 0516-FC07399, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, Hon. Brian C. Wimes, Judgment entered November 22, 2010.

I served as the Guardian ad Litem on this dissolution. The issues included the application of the relocation statute during an initial proceeding, jurisdictional issues, allegations of sexual abuse, evidentiary issues regarding recorded statements by a parent of a child, freedom of religion issues, and evidentiary issues regarding an investigation by a non-Missouri agency. This was an eight day trial, in which I prepared and called the experts, including a psychologist, two licensed clinical social workers, and a supervisor of the visitation. The trial court adopted my recommendation.

In re: The Marriage of Fonte, Case Nos. 0716-FC09052-01 and 0716-FC09052-02, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, Hon. John M. Torrence, Judgment entered April 28, 2010 and May 24, 2010, respectively.

I represented Father on his Motion to Modify Child Support. This case involved determining the income of my client who was a partner in a restaurant franchise. I determined ownership interest in the business, calculated his gross child support income and determined what additional fringe benefits would be considered income for child support purposes. The case had significant discovery disputes involving the internal operations of my client's restaurant franchise business. The trial court reduced my client's support obligation. Just one month after that Judgment was entered, Mother attempted to unilaterally withdraw both children from school and relocate them back to Colorado to an unknown location. I was successful in obtaining a Temporary Restraining Order to prevent Mother from removing the children from school, ordering her to provide her new address, and preventing the immediate relocation of the children to Colorado. Thereafter, the parties reached a mutual agreement regarding the terms of the relocation of the children to Colorado.

In re: The Matter of Hagen v. Rose-Howland, Case No. 0616-FC10897-01 Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, Hon. Corey K. Herron (visiting judge), Judgment entered July 19, 2011.

I represented Father in defending a Motion to Modify Custody, Parenting Time, and Child Support. This case involved determining the income of my client, who was a sole proprietor of a tire franchise, interstate child support enforcement, and proper relocation notice of both parties. The trial court overruled Mother's Motion to Modify, adopted my client's proposed parenting plan, and adopted my client's child support calculation.

In re: The Marriage of Geraci, Case No. 17V010300561-02, Circuit Court of Cass County, Hon. Jacqueline A. Cook, Judgment entered December 9, 2010.

I represented Mother on her Motion to Modify Custody, Child Support, and Visitation. The case involved domestic violence between the parties, domestic violence between

Father and his current spouse, substance abuse and rehabilitation of Mother, the mental health condition of Father, the mental health of one of the children, restrictions on Father's contact with the children, and allegations of abuse and neglect by both parents. I called all of the physicians, therapists, school counselors, and administrators at trial. After the three day bench trial, the trial court adopted my client's proposed parenting plan and child support calculation.

In re: The Marriage of Gleason, Case Nos. 02-FC213419-02, 02-FC213419-03, and 02-FC213419-04, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, Hon. Christine T. Sill-Rogers, Judgment entered January 20, 2012.

I served as the Guardian ad Litem on this Motion to Modify Custody, Child Support, and Visitation. This case involved alienation of the child against a parent, the mental health condition of a parent, and the mental health and medical conditions of my client. When it became evident to me that Petitioner was at or near a psychotic break and a substantial and credible flight risk, I filed a Petition for Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) seeking to transfer custody to Respondent and grant Respondent sole legal and sole physical custody. The trial court granted the TRO and entered a Preliminary Injunction. During the proceedings, I filed three other Motions for Protective Order: 1) to prohibit Petitioner from distributing or publishing any information regarding the proceeding; 2) to prohibit Petitioner from entering locations where the child was known to be found; and 3) to permit counsel only to review the medical and mental health records in the Division 31 courtroom. All three Protective Orders were granted. This was a thirteen day trial in which I prepared and called the nine experts, ranging from psychiatrists, psychologists, pediatricians, allergists, school counselors, and school nurses. The trial court adopted my recommendation.

In re: The Marriage of Gurera, Case No. 0516-FC05053, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, Hon. Michael W. Manners, Judgment entered December 7, 2006.

I represented Mother in this four day dissolution trial. This case involved contested issues of child custody, parenting time, child support, and property and debt division. The Court adopted my client's proposed property and debt division, as well as, her parenting plan and child support calculation.

In re: The Matter of Herrin, Case No. 0616-FC05678, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Hon. Jeffrey L. Bushur, Judgment entered June 27, 2006.

I represented Petitioner-Mother in a Petition for Child Order of Protection case. The issue was whether the child-victim's statements regarding the alleged sexual abuse were reliable; and, thus, admissible hearsay pursuant to In Re: P.K.A. and J.E.A., 725 S.W.2d. 78 (Mo. App. S.D. 1987). I was successful in permitting the child's counselor to testify regarding the child's statements, rather than the child being compelled to testify and confront her alleged abuser. After the evidence began, Respondent consented to the Judgment Full Order of Protection and supervised visitation of the child by Stipulation.

Kazmier v. Director of Revenue, State of Missouri, Case No. 0516-CV12014, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Hon. Jeffrey L. Bushur, Judgment entered September 12, 2005.

I represented Mr. Kazmier at the judicial review of his administrative suspension of his driver's license due to his refusal to submit to a breathalyzer. At trial I was successful in getting his license reinstated.

In re: The Matter of J.E.L., D.O., Case No. MR57503, Missouri Board of Healing Arts, Disposition: Corrective Action Ordered, October 2006.

I represented J.E.L., a physician, in a hearing before the Missouri Board of Healing Arts in a matter involving the adequacy of the physician's documentation to support the necessity of the procedures performed. I was successful in obtaining corrective action for the physician, without an imposition of fine or discipline.

Peterson (Trustee) v. Hunt, Case No. 0816-CV02031, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, Hon. Robert L. Trout, Judgment entered April 11, 2008.

I represented Mr. Peterson in his Petition for Rent and Possession. I was successful in obtaining possession for Mr. Peterson, as well as, a Judgment against the defendant for the past rent, property damage, and attorney's fees.

In re: The Marriage of Rauzi, Case No. 16DR96-03569-02, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, Hon. Roger M. Prokes (visiting judge), Judgment entered February 24, 2010.

I represented Mother in a contempt action seeking to enforce the 2006 Judgment. This was a highly litigated case with significant discovery disputes and several pretrial motions which were argued. After the two day bench trial, the trial court found Father to be in contempt for failing to abide by the terms of the 2006 Judgment.

In re: The Marriage of Riggs, Case No. 0616-FC11353

In the Interests of: KR, RR, RR and SR, Case Nos. 0816-JU000010, 0816-JU000011, 0816-JU000012, and 0816-JU000013, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, Hon. W. Stephen Nixon, Judgment entered October 12, 2010.

I was the Guardian ad Litem on all matters regarding this family. This case began as a dissolution action. Almost immediately, the juvenile court became involved in allegations of sexual abuse by two family members, as well as, allegations of medical and dental neglect of the children. The majority of the proceedings involved the juvenile court matters. Respondent absconded with the children twice. The first time I filed a Writ of Habeas Corpus, which was granted and the children were returned to Missouri. The second time Respondent absconded I made an Amber Alert and worked closely with law enforcement authorities in three states. After 29 days, Respondent and the children were found at the Washington/Canada border safe and unharmed. During the proceedings, a community group befriended Respondent and began posting sensitive information about the case and my clients on the Internet. I filed a Motion for Protective Order to Prohibit Respondent or her agents from distributing or publishing any information about the proceedings. Ultimately, the parties entered into a Stipulated

Protective Order. The issues in the juvenile matter and the dissolution involved interstate jurisdiction, including the interplay between the UCCJEA and the UCCJA (which Missouri had at the time), parental alienation, mental health issues, medical needs of the children, educational needs of the children, and permanency planning. After fourteen days of contested hearings over more than two years, an agreement was reached between the parties.

In addition to the above cases, like all litigators I have settled many cases. Listed below are two cases which I believe are significant:

State of Missouri v. Stone, Case Nos. 1116-CR03797 and 1116-CR03797-01
Circuit Court of Jackson County, Hon. Vernon E. Scoville, III, Judgment entered April 4, 2012.

I represented Ms. Stone in Kansas and Missouri on two prescription drug fraud cases. In the Kansas matter, State of Kansas v. Stone, Case No. 11CR00368, Ms. Stone was charged with felony possession of a controlled substance and unlawfully obtaining a prescription, also a felony charge. I was successful in obtaining diversion. Thereafter, she was charged in Missouri with one felony count of fraudulently attempting to obtain a controlled substance. I was successful in obtaining a plea agreement of probation with a two year suspended imposition of sentence.

Jellee Works Productions, Inc., et al. v. Awards & T-Shirts Specialists, Inc. et al.
Case No. 0716-CV14061, Circuit Court of Jackson County, Hon. Margaret L. Sauer, Case Dismissed November 19, 2007.

I defended Ms. O'Donohue and her company in a breach of contract case. I also filed a counter-claim alleging breach of contract, misrepresentation, and interference with business practices. I was successful in negotiating a cash settlement for my client and getting her business name and products removed from Plaintiff's website.

I represented Mr. Greiner in his appeal of the trial court's decision regarding maintenance, property distribution, and attorney's fees. I authored the brief and argued the case before the Western District. The trial court was affirmed.

In re: The Marriage of Riggs, WD73992, Western District of Missouri, Case
Dismissed January 21, 2012.

This was an appeal by Mr. Riggs of my award of Guardian ad Litem fees. Counsel for Appellant and I worked out an agreement and the case was dismissed.

In addition to the above-listed cases, I also had a significant role in the following appellate cases:

In re: The Marriage of Bond, 113 S.W.3d 283 (Mo. App. E.D. 2003), September 19, 2003, Affirmed.

I was co-counsel on the appeal with Ms. W. Ann Hansbrough. We represented Petitioner, in her appeal seeking a larger increase in her maintenance than granted by the trial court. I researched the issues and drafted a significant portion of the brief. The trial court was affirmed.

In re: The Marriage of Rauzi, 226 S.W.3d 905 (Mo. App. W.D. 2007), July 18, 2007, Affirmed.

I served as co-counsel on this matter with Mr. Patrick W. Campbell. We represented Mother in Father's appeal of the trial court's decision granting Mother sole legal custody of the minor children and a judgment against Father for past due medical expenses. I conducted all the research for the brief, drafted significant portions of the brief, and argued the case before the Western District. The trial court's decision was affirmed.

In re: The Adoption of N.L.B., MT & ST v. CL, Case No. 212 S.W.3d 123 (Mo banc. 2007), January 9, 2007, Reversed and remanded.

I served as co-counsel with Ms. Cheri Cole Simpkins. We represented Petitioners M.T. and S.T., the adoptive parents, in Respondent's appeal of the adoption by contesting the validity of the putative father registry pursuant to Mo. Rev. Stat. Section 452.030.3. The trial court was reversed.

In re: The Adoption of N.L.B., MT & ST v. CL, Case No. 274 S.W. 3d 619 (Mo. App. W.D. 2009), January 27, 2009, Reversed and remanded.

I served as co-counsel on this appeal with Ms. Simpkins. We again represented Petitioners M.T. and S.T., the adoptive parents, in the Respondent's appeal of the trial court's decision, on remand, to terminate his parental rights and again approve the adoption of N.L.B. by our clients. The trial court was reversed.

Rauzi, et al. v. Edwards, et al., Case No. 0816-CV07774, claims against me dismissed with prejudice December 21, 2009 and entire matter dismissed on May 12, 2010.

In 2006, I previously represented co-defendant Shelly Edwards in a Motion to Modify Custody, Visitation, and Support. She was granted sole legal custody and was also awarded a monetary Judgment against her ex-husband. I also represented her in the appeal before the Western District, which affirmed the trial court. I requested a lien on her ex-husband's real estate for money owed to my client pursuant to the 2006 Judgment. He is an attorney. Acting *pro se*, he filed suit against his ex-wife, my former managing partner, and me. He claimed the filing of the lien prevented him from obtaining a better loan rate to purchase real estate. The claims against me were dismissed on summary judgment with prejudice on December 21, 2009.

I own commercial rental property with my mother and brother. As a result of my ownership interest in this property, my family has filed two lawsuits:

Scaglia, et al. v. Earthgrains Baking Company, Case No. 01CV200878, dismissed February 4, 2001.

This matter was an action by the property owners (the Scaglias) against the tenant (Earth Grains) in small claims court for breach of contract. The case resolved amicably and was dismissed.

Scaglia, et al. and Labor Ready v. City of Kansas City, Missouri, et al., Case No. 0516-CV06086, case dismissed April 15, 2013.

This was an action by the property owners (the Scaglias) and the tenant (Labor Ready) seeking to enjoin the City from ceasing the day labor business operations of tenant Labor Ready. The dispute involved the City's unlawful taking of Plaintiffs' Certificate of Non-Conforming Use based on an untimely filing. Ultimately, the case settled in mediation.

Most importantly, I learned from Judge Moorhouse to do your best, make a decision, and advise the parties of the rationale for the decision. From her example I understand the role and job of a judge. insight into the method and need for the "*pro se* forms," the challenges judicial officers face with self-represented litigants, and the parameters a judicial officer must work within.

The issues addressed in the associate divisions are arguably the most important and significant to people; and, often times, these cases are an individual's only exposure to the courts. This is truly the window to our judicial system for many individuals.

My legal work and professional activities have demonstrated my commitment to working to uphold the integrity and maintain the dignity of the profession. I believe I have a reputation of being courteous, ethical, prepared, detail-oriented, following the rules yet being reasonable, and sympathetic to the situation. I would carry this commitment into my role as a judicial officer by applying the law to the facts to render timely decisions, doing my best each day under the circumstances presented, and always providing every litigant and counsel the utmost respect.
