During my service as an Assistant Circuit Attorney, I have participated in every aspect of criminal prosecution. I have analyzed and issued hundreds of cases, ranging from low-level misdemeanors to robberies, assaults and murders. As a member of the Circuit Attorney's Office, I have practiced in front of nearly every Circuit Judge in the 22nd Judicial Circuit. I have taken hundreds of guilty pleas, been involved in numerous sentencing for crimes stemming from drug-related offenses to murders, and covered probation revocation hearings in several divisions. I am also experienced with multiple types of motion hearings, including bond reductions, motions to suppress and motions to dismiss. While serving as first and second chair in jury trials I have secured convictions on cases ranging from misdemeanors to murders.

As a member and now the Unit Leader of our White Collar/Fraud Unit, I handle a number of other legal duties on our office's behalf. For example, I routinely represent the Circuit Attorney's Office in civil cases, including lawsuits filed against employees of our office, mental health proceedings, conditional release hearings and civil commitments. As the Unit Leader I oversee and manage four attorneys, four staff members and an investigator. I also ensure that the duties undertaken by our unit are handled in an efficient and effective manner. I am routinely consulted on complicated legal issues, both at the trial level and the appellate level, and have drafted or assisted in drafting several writs and motions to ensure that the Circuit Attorney's Office's interests are properly represented.

Additionally, The White Collar/Fraud Unit of the Circuit Attorney's Office is often asked to handle special investigations and projects. As that Unit's leader, I am intimately involved with, and frequently in charge of, those projects. I have been asked to review habeas corpus proceedings, research issues related to evidentiary and sentencing procedures and implement a system to collect restitution on behalf of our victims. I have also frequently interfaced with members of state and federal agencies during confidential investigations and case reviews involving alleged criminal activity. While the details of those investigations are largely private, I work hard to ensure the interests of the community are well represented.

Prior to serving as an Assistant Circuit Attorney for the City of St. Louis, I worked for two private law firms – Stinson Morrison Hecker (now Stinson Leonard Street) and Thompson

Coburn - as a corporate and securities attorney. During this time I worked extensively on drafting and reviewing securities filings with the SEC, including proxy statements, Annual and Quarterly Reports and insider reports. I directly participated in the drafting of proxy statements and other SEC documents for a New York banking corporation that was one of the 20 largest banks in America.

Beyond my compliance work, I drafted asset and stock purchase agreements, conducted due diligence and closed deals, including bank acquisitions and the purchase of multiple insurance agencies. Specifically, I personally organized and completed the closing of an insurance agency in Glens Falls, New York, and was involved in the negotiation and purchase of a Florida bank by a Midwest banking corporation.

My experience in private practice also included extensive review of state and federal statutes and regulations for corporate clients. I spent considerable time advising banking organizations on the rules and regulations of the Missouri Division of Finance, the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency and the Office of Thrift Supervision.

Additionally, I counseled individual and corporate clients on conducting business in the State of Missouri. This included drafting deeds of trust, leases and other documents, as well as investigating issues related to real estate ownership in locations throughout the United States. I participated in the formation of companies in Missouri and other states, including both corporations and limited liability companies. I also drafted, reviewed and negotiated various contracts for individual and corporate clients.

All of this experience demonstrates a depth of legal knowledge that goes well beyond the criminal law that I have practiced for the last eight years. My years as a private practitioner give me a unique and more thorough understanding of the law than many of my peers and would be invaluable to me as a Judge.

As an attorney in the private sector and as a Unit Leader at the Circuit Attorney's Office I have managed both staff members and other attorneys. I have learned much in my years as a manager about how to motivate peers, associates and team members, and I believe these skills are imperative to maintaining a strong and efficient courtroom.

As a representative of the Circuit Attorney's Office I also represent and work with members of the community on a regular basis. For two years I served as the Circuit Attorney's Office's representative to the Gravois Park Neighborhood. In that capacity I attended meetings and updated community leaders on issues affecting their neighborhood. As a courtroom advocate, I have interacted with victims, community members and leaders and other individuals who care deeply about the City of St. Louis and making it the best city possible. I myself have been a city resident since returning from college in Illinois in 2000. I am invested in our community and dedicated to making it better. Working for the Circuit Attorney's Office and having the chance to speak with and learn from community members has benefitted me profoundly, and given me a comprehensive perspective on the issues that we, as city residents, face on a regular basis.

In each case listed below I served as an Assistant Circuit Attorney representing the State of Missouri.

Defendant entered a car wash and asked for a job. When he was told by the victim that the owner was not there, he lingered at the car wash, eventually pulling a gun and robbing the victim of money and his phone. When another individual came into the car wash, the defendant pointed the gun at him, and ended up shooting the original victim near the groin. The victim nearly died from his injuries. The jury found the defendant guilty of all charges and he was sentenced to 20 years in the Missouri Department of Corrections.

Defendant and other unidentified individuals burst into a home where the victim was watching television with his girlfriend upstairs. When defendant came downstairs to see what was going on, the defendant and the others fired numerous shots at the victim, killing him. The defendant presumably thought that a different individual lived in the home, as the victim had no connection to the defendant. The jury found the defendant guilty on all counts and he was sentenced to life in the Missouri Department of Corrections without the possibility of parole. I served as second chair.
