I was appointed by Governor Nixon in November of 2012 to the present position of Associate Circuit Judge. Since my appointment, I have primarily been assigned to three civil divisions in the City of St. Louis (Division 27, 28 and 29). Additionally, I have sat in Division 25, a Criminal Assignment Division and Division 14, a Domestic/Family Division. While presiding in the civil divisions, I have had the opportunity to hear cases ranging from simple landlord/tenant and small claim disputes to cases dealing with the Fair Debt Collection and Practice Act and the Missouri Merchandising Practice Act. In my assignment to Division 27 (the Civil Bulk Assignment Division), I presided over the resolution of over 17,000 cases. While in Division 29 and Division 28, the Civil Associate Jury Trial Division and the Civil Associate Bench Trial Division, respectively, I had the opportunity to preside and hear both associate and circuit civil jury and bench trials, ranging from slip and falls to complex contractual litigation. In addition, I have been assigned by the presiding judge to preside over a number of felony jury cases including narcotics, offenses against persons and property, and stealing offenses.

Prior to my appointment, I was engaged in the practice of law for 25 years. I appeared in 27 different judicial circuits within the State of Missouri and five United States Districts. While in the practice of law, I have tried in excess of 90 criminal and civil cases to jury verdict in both state and federal courts. The cases listed above represent a small sample of different types of litigation in which I have been involved. I cannot estimate with any precision the number of cases in which I have prepared for trial that were negotiated to a successful settlement or a plea of guilty. Those cases required me to exercise skills in client counseling, motion practice, and discovery, including both the taking and defending of depositions.

I am AV Peer Review rated, which is the highest ranking achievable for Martindale Hubbell and listed in the Bar Registry of Preeminent Lawyers. I was profiled in Missouri and Kansas City Super Lawyers Magazine from 2006 to 2012. I was selected by my peers to be included in the *Best Lawyers in America*, 19<sup>th</sup> Edition for work in the practice of criminal defense: white collar.
