12. Describe the nature and extent of your experience as a practicing attorney in the trial and appellate courts, and explain how such experience demonstrates the quality of your legal work.

During my twenty-two years as an attorney, I represented litigants in civil, criminal, and family law matters. I participated in ten jury trials, including six murder trials. I tried numerous civil bench trials, including tort actions, contract actions, and corporate litigation. As a civil litigator, I was primarily an attorney for plaintiffs in a wide variety of litigation ranging from actions brought under 42 U.S.C. § 1982 to automobile financing deficiency actions.

While my responsibilities in criminal jury trials will be characterized as 'second chair', I participated in voir dire for each trial, presented opening statements and closing arguments, examined multiple witnesses, and participated in instruction conferences.

I participated in numerous family law trials during my practice. I routinely tried twenty-five to forty family law cases per year. Many of these trials were multiple-day bench trials. I also served as guardian ad litem for children in contested custody and termination of parental rights actions.

Beginning in 2006, I have served as Family Court Commissioner in Division 43 where I hear many contested domestic bench trials. In addition to contested trials, my duties include managing the prosecutors' contempt, paternity, and criminal non-support diversion dockets. Since my arrival in Division 43, I consistently hear and decide over 150 contested matters each year. Upon my reappointment in 2010, Missouri Bar members gave me an overall 94% approval rating. This included 94% of attorneys "agree or strongly agree" that I "treat people equally regardless of race, gender, ethnicity, economic status, or any other factor", "allow parties latitude to present their arguments", and "weigh all evidence fairly and impartially". Of the 98 Missouri Bar members responding, 96% "agree or strongly agree" that I am "prepared for hearings and trials" and "demonstrate appropriate demeanor on bench".

Finally, I endeavor to fulfill my responsibilities as a steward of my profession. I routinely speak at conferences throughout each year, including new guardian ad litem training where I have an opportunity to address young lawyers. Every semester I also work with law students from UMKC to prepare them for their first courtroom experience.

All of my experiences share some commonalities that demonstrate the quality of my legal work. I have always honored and respected the courtroom. Whether as a litigator or jurist, I valued the right of litigants to present their evidence in a fair hearing and receive a judgment consistent with the laws of our state. As a practicing attorney, I always attempted to zealously represent my clients while maintaining a professional relationship with other attorneys and litigants. As a member of the bench, I similarly strive to conduct my courtroom in a manner that allows for dignified and respectful resolution of conflicts.

Dean v. St. Luke's Hospital

Before the Missouri Division of Workers' Compensation in August 1995, I represented claimant Evelyn Dean—a nurse injured while employed at St. Luke's Hospital. Future medical payments were the primary contested issue. The matter was tried before the Administrative Hearing Officer and on appeal before the Missouri Workers' Compensation Commission in Jefferson City, Missouri. Finally, I successfully defended claimant's award of future medical benefits on appeal in *Dean v. St. Luke's Hospital*, 936 S.W.2d 601 (Mo. Ct. App. 1997).

Rolfe v. Parker, Case No. 16CV96-04859

I tried this case in Division 15 of the Jackson County Circuit Court, Missouri, in September 1996. I represented Plaintiffs James R. Rolfe, George Wilken, Edward R. Sechrest, and Eddie Lee in a civil action contending that they were improperly removed from their corporate positions at the Church of Christ "With Elijah Message" Established Anew 1929, Inc., a general not-for-profit corporation. Petitions were consolidated with the interpleader action filed by banks holding the not-for-profit corporation's assets. Following a three-day bench trial, the court denied plaintiffs' claims on the basis that the dispute involved ecclesiastical matters not within the jurisdiction of the courts of law. I further represented the plaintiffs on appeal in *Rolfe v. Parker*, 968 S.W.2d 178 (Mo. Ct. App. 1998).

Deirdra Curry v. State of Missouri, Case No. 16CV96-14688

I was the sole attorney representing Plaintiffs Dierdra and Keenan Curry and their four minor children. This tort action in Division 1 of Jackson County Circuit Court, Missouri, was against Missouri Department of Family Services, individual state employees, and private therapists contracted by State of Missouri alleging their failure to warn plaintiffs that a foster child placed in their care was a sexual predator. The plaintiffs settled with the private parties and the trial court granted the State of Missouri's Motion to Dismiss based upon sovereign immunity. I further represented the plaintiffs on appeal in *Curry, et. al. v. State of Missouri*, 39 S.W.3d 103 (Mo. Ct. App. 1999).

Robert Barker v. Gerald Barker, Case No. 99FC203506

I tried this case on April 2, 2001, in Division 42 of the Jackson County Circuit Court, Missouri, as the sole attorney representing parents, Gerald and Christie Barker. Paternal grandparent of my clients' children petitioned for grandparent visitation rights. The case involved the application of *Troxel v. Granville*, 530 U.S. 57 (2000), in an attempt to have R.S.Mo. § 452.402 declared void by the trial court as violating my clients', the natural parents, constitutional right to family privacy. The trial court ruled in favor of movant grandparents.

In re the Marriage of Engeman, Case No. 99FC205433

I tried this dissolution of marriage action on March 20, April 22, April 24, May 23, June 24, and June 25, 2002, in Division 2 of the Jackson County Circuit Court, Missouri. I was sole counsel for Petitioner Barbara Engeman. Unusual legal issues in family law practice included joining a third party (business partner); a count for the quiet title of real estate; dissolution of a business partnership and application of Missouri's Partnership Act; expert testimony for the valuation of six parcels of real estate; valuation of partnership business assets; dissipation of assets; and several physical inspections of land pursuant to Missouri Rules of Civil Procedure. Petitioner obtained a favorable judgment from the trial court regarding these issues and I represented Petitioner on appeal in *Engeman v. Engeman*, 123 S.W.3d 227 (Mo. Ct. App. 2003).

In re the Marriage of Krough, Case No. 16DR98-04231

This case was tried in Division 42 of the Jackson County Circuit Court, Missouri, over a three-day period from February 18 to June 30, 2003. I was appointed as guardian ad litem for the parties' three minor children in this modification action involving allegations of alienation of the children. Evidence was presented at trial forming the basis for concurrent prosecution of five counts for forgery and three counts for fraudulent use of credit device. The trial court entered a judgment consistent with my recommendations.

In re the Marriage of Stoneberger, Case No. 02-FC-201257

This divorce was tried in Division 33 of the Jackson County Circuit Court over a period of six days, beginning in July 2003, and concluding on December 18, 2003. I was appointed guardian ad litem for the parties' minor child. Respondent was alleged to have sexually molested the parties' child and a stepson. Extensive evidence was involved relating to the crucial determination of whether the stepson's reports of sexual abuse were "reliable" and, therefore, admissible hearsay under standards established in Missouri case law. The trial court entered a custody judgment granting Respondent supervised visitation with his child.

In re the Marriage of Jackson, Case No. 04FC206725

This case was tried in Division 8 of the Jackson County Circuit Court, Missouri, on April 19 and 27, 2005. I represented husband in this dissolution of marriage action involving issues of child custody, child support, maintenance, property and debt division, and attorney fees. Evidence was presented including testimony from a vocational expert regarding wife's potential ability to earn income and division of various stock options from American Century Investments. The trial court entered a judgment dissolving the parties' marriage and dividing all assets consistent with husband's requests.

In re the Marriage of Thorsen, Case No. 16DR97-05795-02

This case was tried in Division 42 of the Jackson County Circuit Court, Missouri, on July 8, 2005. I represented mother in this custody modification action wherein my client sought a change of custody for the parties' minor daughter. A critical interpretation of R.S.Mo. § 452.455 was involved relating to the requirement that the movant post a bond before proceeding with her modification action. Over the objection of State of Missouri, Department of Child Support Enforcement, the trial court entered a judgment allowing mother to proceed without posting a bond and granting her requested modification.

In re the Marriage of Huff, Case No. 01FC206521-03

This case was tried before Division 42 of the Jackson County Circuit Court, Missouri, on February 14 and 15, 2006. I served as guardian ad litem for two young girls in this custody modification action involving accusations that the minor children were sexually abused and testimony from six mental health professionals regarding the veracity of these allegations. The trial court granted mother's request to have unsupervised parenting time with her children.

O'Neill v. O'Neill, 884 S.W.2d 339 (Mo. Ct. App. 1994)

I represented Appellant Dan O'Neill appealing the trial court's judgment denying his motion to emancipate his minor child. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

In re the Adoption of Z.T.H., 910 S.W.2d 830 (Mo. Ct. App. 1995)

I represented Appellant Dan Hawkins, natural father, appealing the trial court's denial of his motion to set aside the adoption of his son. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

Dean v. St. Luke's Hospital, 936 S.W.2d 601 (Mo. Ct. App. 1997)

I represented Respondent Evelyn Dean, in St. Luke's appeal of the trial court's judgment awarding her future medical expenses in her workers' compensation action. The appellate court affirmed the Missouri Workers' Compensation Commission.

Johnson v. Johnson, 965 S.W.2d 943 (Mo. Ct. App. 1998)

I represented Respondent in Appellant Mother's appeal alleging trial court erred in denying her claim for statutory interest that accrued on child support payments due more than ten years earlier. The appellate court reversed the trial court.

Rolfe v. Parker, 968 S.W.2d 178 (Mo. Ct. App. 1998)

I represented Appellants Rolfe, et. al., appealing the trial court's judgment denying their petition for corporate accounting and declaratory judgment. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

Bank 10 v. Church of Christ "With the Elijah Message," Established Anew 1929, Inc., 967 S.W.2d 684 (Mo. Ct. App. 1998)

Similar to Rolfe v. Parker, above, I represented Appellants Rolfe, et. al., appealing the trial court's determination that Parker, et. al., controlled the assets held by Bank 10 in the bank's interpleader action. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

Curry v. State of Missouri, 39 S.W.3d 103 (Mo. Ct. App. 1999)

I represented Appellants Dierdra Curry, et. al., appealing the trial court's determination that State of Missouri, Department of Family Services, was entitled to sovereign immunity regarding Appellants' tort claims. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

Miers v. Miers, 53 S.W.3d 592 (Mo. Ct. App. 2001)

I represented Respondent in the appeal alleging the trial court's error in awarding custody to Respondent. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

Chavez v. Walters, 78 S.W.3d 234 (Mo. Ct. App. 2002)

I represented Respondent Marvin Walters in his appeal alleging the trial court erred in dismissing custodial parent's Petition for Child Order of Protection. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

Engeman v. Engeman, 123 S.W.3d 227 (Mo. Ct. App. 2003)

I represented Respondent Barbara Engeman in her appeal alleging the trial court's error in dividing partnership assets, marital assets, and child custody determination. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

Rauzi v. Rauzi, 226 S.W.3d 905 (Mo. Ct. App. 2007)

I represented Respondent, Shelly Edwards f/k/a Rauzi, in the appeal contesting trial court's judgment granting Respondent's motion to modify custody, visitation, and child support. The appellate court affirmed the trial court.

As Family Court Commissioner, I adjudicate contested family law cases, including dissolution of marriage, child custody, child support, and modification actions. I also hear civil contempt cases filed by Jackson County Prosecutor's Office and Missouri Attorney General's office; paternity cases from Prosecutor's Office; and family access cases.

As Family Court Commissioner, I administer Jackson County's Child Support Court program (previously Fathering Court), a Jackson Country Circuit Court treatment program for criminal non-support defendants in cooperation with the Jackson County Prosecutor's Office and the Missouri Public Defender's Office.

Haddock v. Haddock et al., Case No. 1016-FC08496

This trial, concluded in November, 2011, involved a dissolution of marriage action addressing child custody, supervised visitation, and child support. Multiple witnesses addressed issues relating to supervised visits occurring at The Connections Program. Jackson County, Missouri was joined as party for payment of guardian ad litem fees from public funds.

Godden v. Schellinger, Case No. 0816-MC01347

This case was tried over two days concluding in December, 2010, and involved modification of child custody and supervised visitation. Evidence of drug usage, physical abuse, and medical neglect was presented at trial. At commencement, the case also involved interpretation and application of Missouri Supreme Court Rule 92 relating to the issuance of a temporary restraining order.

Lindgren v. Lindgren, Case No. 04FC208766

This three-day trial concluded in April, 2009, involving a modification of custody, visitation, and child support. Substantial evidence was presented for the valuation of Respondent's corporation and the inclusion of corporate-retained earnings in Respondent's income for the purpose of calculating child support.

Cantwell v. Cantwell, Case No. 04FC212729

This three-day trial was concluded in January, 2009 and also involved a motion to modify custody, visitation and child support. Testimony was heard from multiple police officers and workers from Missouri Division of Social Services regarding drug and parenting issues.

Emerson v. Emerson, Case No. 0516-FC05280

This eight-day trial was concluded in August, 2008. Testimony from multiple medical and psychological professionals and experts was heard regarding allegations of sexual abuse. The trial included multiple determinations of the admissibility of child statements to medical and psychological professionals regarding abuse.

In re the Marriage of Bergschneider, Case No. 04FC208214

This motion to modify was presented in July, 2008, involving a custodial parent relocating two minor children approximately six hours from the non-custodial parent in contravention of the relocation provisions of R.S.Mo. § 452.377. The two minor children were interviewed on the record as part of the proceedings. The proposed relocation was denied and custody was transferred to the non-custodial parent.

In re the Marriage of Lewis, Case No. 0716-FC05976

This dissolution of marriage case was tried over two days in August, 2008 and included a custody dispute involving alienation of the parties' children and false allegations of sexual abuse. Evidence at trial included two S.A.F.E. medical exams from Children's Mercy Hospital, a forensic interview at the Child Protection Center, and testimony from Children's Division investigators.

In re the Marriage of Irvin, Case No. 16DR98-00736

This case was tried over three days concluding in June, 2007, involving computation of college expenses; determination of child support and medical support arrears; and distribution of college funds. Considerable evidence was involved on the issue of emancipating the parties' daughter for failure to provide notice of college enrollment pursuant to R.S.Mo. § 452.340.

Hansen v. Bates, Case No. 16DR96-02066-04

This trial was conducted over three days in August, 2007, in Division 9, involving a non-custodial parent's motion to modify. I was trying the matter for Judge Kelly Moorhouse during her illness. The parties' son was living in Germany, where the custodial parent was stationed during military duty. Several appellate opinions were applied holding that relocation in compliance with R.S.Mo. § 452.377 shall not subsequently form the basis of an alleged change in circumstances in a later request to modify the custodial provisions.

Taylor v. State of Missouri et al., Case No. 16DR84-03949

Tried in March, 2007, this case involved the application of a rare theory in child support law of "waiver by acquiescence". Respondent was forgiven substantial child support arrears due to a written agreement entered into between the parties many years earlier. The judgment was affirmed on appeal.




