

Quality of Legal Work

I have worked to enhance my skills as a trial lawyer and Judge. I was selected as a Military Judge for Special Courts Martial while on active duty. I have written articles on trial practice and a chapter for the Missouri Bar CLE Handbook on trial practice. I had frequently lectured attorneys prior to becoming a judge on matters involving family law, municipal law and land use issues. Since taking the bench I have presented the update on family law to the Association of Associate and Probate Judges and I have been asked to present again in the coming year. I have lectured several times to lawyers on court room procedures since taking the bench. My accomplishments during my career include:

Question No. 14

Clients Who Have Sued

1. I was sued by one client claiming that we had not adequately presented expert testimony in a suit in Federal Court. The issue was the insurance company's denial of a claim for damages arising from the client's house burning to the ground. The malpractice claim was tried before a jury in St. Louis County. The jury returned a Defendant's verdict. I was co-counsel on the underlying case, but it was my client.
2. I sued a client for fees after representing her in a dissolution action. After I filed suit, she filed a counterclaim alleging malpractice. Client claimed a failure to obtain the full value of assets and the failure to discover all of the assets of the marriage. The suit has been dismissed.

Background

Judge Beach was appointed to the 21st Judicial Circuit Bench as an associate circuit judge in 2005. He graduated from Central Connecticut State University with a bachelor's degree in social science and received his juris doctorate degree from the New England School of Law.

Before his appointment to the circuit bench, Judge Beach spent many years in private practice. Judge Beach is a past president of the American Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers, past president of the St. Louis County Bar Association, a lecturer on family law Issues for The Missouri Bar, and a member of the Missouri Association of Probate and Associate Court Judges. Judge Beach serves on the board of The Children's Home Society of Missouri, the Program Committee of Kids in the Middle, and is a member of Bonhomme Presbyterian Church. Judge Beach is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Marine Corps.

Discussion

The attorneys who responded to the survey questions rated Judge Beach highly in all areas, with slightly higher marks in the areas of treating all people equally regardless of background, preparedness for hearings and trials, maintaining proper order and decorum in the courtroom, legal competency, and understanding the rules of procedure and evidence.

Judge Beach received slightly lower marks in the areas of weighing of evidence before making a decision and giving latitude to parties to present arguments.

Since Judge Beach has served in family court, no juror surveys were available for review.

The committee also reviewed written opinions of Judge Beach. His opinions, particularly those in financially complicated dissolutions and family court matters, are clearly-written and reflect a high level of legal competency.

Recommendation

The 21st Judicial Circuit Performance Evaluation Committee recommends that Judge Douglas R. Beach **BE RETAINED**.
