I have enjoyed a variety of in-depth experiences as a practicing attorney in various courts in Missouri, Kansas and in Federal court. In the 20 years I have practiced, I have represented parties in contested cases or matters before State and Federal trial courts and in the Missouri Court of Appeals. Filed with this application is Attachment 1, which provides more comprehensive comments on how I believe my professional experiences demonstrate the quality of my legal work and ability to serve as a Judge.

My experience and qualifications include the following:

BV Rated - According to the Martindale Hubble Lawyer Peer Review Service, this rating scale ranks me as "High to Very High" in legal ability and "Very High" on ethical conduct.

Jury Trial Experience: I have personally served as first chair or lead trial counsel on 11 jury trials (and second chaired 1 other) in both State and

Federal courts. In addition to these cases I have litigated approximately 115 cases wherein a jury trial was demanded but the cases were resolved prior to trial following depositions and/or mediation. I have represented both plaintiffs and defendants ranging from all types of private parties and Clay County, Missouri. My jury trial or more advanced litigation experience is primarily in the areas of personal injury claims, employment law or wrongful termination claims, fraud and commercial contract claims, and criminal law.

Bench Trial Experience: I have personally served as lead counsel on more than 100 bench trials in a variety of case types. I tried or litigated divorce cases, guardian and conservator trials, probate claims, Employment Retirement Income Security Act actions, civil injunction actions, breach of contract and contract enforcement, declaratory judgment actions, and actions for injunctions, real estate disputes and a number of municipal court bench trials.

Missouri Trial Courts: I have conducted cases in Clay County, Cass County, Clinton County, Ray County, Jackson County, Daviess County, Livingston County, Benton County, and Chariton County, Missouri among others.

Kansas Trial Courts: I have conducted cases in Johnson County, Wyandotte County and Sumner County, Kansas.

Federal Court Experience: In my practice, I typically will have a case or a part of a case in Federal court once every two years. These cases include diversity jurisdiction cases, Federal statutory claims such as false claims under the Patent Act or other Federal statutes or certain employment or wrongful termination claims. I recently concluded a case in the Eastern District of Texas. I have also been admitted to the Eight Circuit Court of Appeals.

Michele Chambers v. Harrah's North Kansas City, LLC:

Case No. 7 CV 105005583 (2007)
Circuit Court of Clay County, Missouri

This case involved the wrongful termination of a security employee, Michele Chambers, because of her objections with regard to Harrah's violations and directions to violate Missouri State Gaming Regulations. I served as co-counsel in this action with attorney Kevin Baldwin representing Plaintiff. My role in the

litigation included presenting the case opening statement, navigating the various statutes and gaming regulations using Gaming Commission witnesses and law enforcement officers and further included presenting the evidence and closing argument with regard to punitive damages. This case involved over 4,000 pages of documents, a \$22 Billion international gaming organization and a highly complex area of state gaming regulations, and resulted in a unanimous jury verdict in favor of our client for compensatory and punitive damages of \$1,000,000.00.

GFSI, Inc. (Gear for Sports, Inc.) v. Jeffery Knapp:

Case No. 05 CV 05937 (2005)

District Court of Johnson County, Kansas

This case involved an action for breach of contract, and sought both temporary and permanent injunctions to specifically enforce a former regional sales director's non-compete agreement. I represented Jeffery Knapp. The case involved a large amount of discovery related to product sales nationally, branding and analysis of sales data in comparison between Gear for Sports and Mr. Knapp's new position with Tehama Company, a company co-owned by actor Clint Eastwood. The most notable issue in the case was an issue of first impression in Kansas (and Missouri at the time) regarding whether a company can use a stock transfer to an employee as the legal basis for a restrictive covenant agreement even though the company retained an option to buy back the stock on termination for virtually no cost. We tried the temporary motion for three days and submitted closing briefs on the question of valid or legal consideration and other fact issues. The parties reached a sudden settlement after trial which I believe was a result of the ability of Mr. Knapp and myself to expose the factual and legal complications with the harsh result sought by Gear for Sports. I was the sole counsel representing Mr. Knapp in this case.

State v. John Collins and David Jackson:

Case No. CR 301-714 (2002)

Circuit Court of Cass County, Missouri

In this case I represented two defendants who were each accused of resisting arrest and assault upon law enforcement officers in the third degree. The primary issue in the case was whether Mr. Collins and Mr. Jackson in fact resisted and assaulted the officers or whether the officers had overreacted themselves. The case was tried to a jury and involved audio and video recordings, multiple police officer witnesses, policies and analysis of the highway where the events took place. The significance of this case is that we successfully won acquittals for both men under both assault charges and their convictions for "resisting arrest" were relegated to misdemeanors with no jail sentences and only a \$250.00 fine per person. I was the sole trial counsel for the defendants in this case.

Richard Curnow v. Duane Smith:

Case No. 7 CV 100007462 (2000)

Circuit Court of Clay County, Missouri

In this case I represented Richard Curnow, who had invested \$40,000.00 in a prime debenture purchase transaction whereby foreign debt obligations would be purchased and resold on the international market. The legal question involved was whether the investment was personally guaranteed or whether the defendant was required to repay the \$40,000.00 regardless of the failure of the investment. The case also involved a debate over the proper application of the statute of limitations and whether the claims of my client were time barred. I was sole counsel for Dr. Curnow and after trial and post-trial briefs, judgment was entered for Dr. Curnow for the full amount. I later successfully defended the judgment on appeal.

Jessica Korell v. St. Joseph Riverboat Partners:

Case No. 98-6104-CV-SJ-SOW (2000)

Federal District Court, Western District of Missouri

This case involved a sexual harassment and discrimination action wherein I served as lead trial counsel representing Jessica Korell. Ms. Korell had been subjected to offensive comments about her looks and her complaints about sexual harassment were met with retaliation and termination. After an extensive discovery process and nearly four days of trial, the defendant casino capitulated and offered to pay Ms. Korell's requested compensation. The settlement was confidential. The key to our success in this case was a relentless pursuit of documentation and witnesses who were willing to speak the truth. During the process we found the key witnesses who would later testify at trial to uncover that Ms. Korell's manager had in fact retaliated because of her report of sexual harassment and discrimination.

Clay County, Missouri v. Harley & Suzie Bogue, Bogue Farms, Inc.:

Case No. CV 196-2686 (2000)

Circuit Court of Clay County, Missouri

In this case, Clay County sought a declaratory judgment action regarding the constitutionality of its zoning regulations regarding the expansion of hog farms in the county. The Bogues filed counterclaims for inverse condemnation damages of over \$700,000.00. They alleged that their entire hog farm expansion and operation was shut down as a result of the County's zoning regulations. I was co-counsel at trial in this action with attorney Kevin Graham representing Clay County. I was responsible for the evidence and argument regarding the existence or non-existence of the Bogues' alleged damages. My work included study and preparation regarding the hog farm and sales industries and the use of an agricultural economist to debunk the allegations of lost profits. After a trial on all issues, we secured a judgment in favor of Clay County and it was reported as one of the most significant verdicts in 2000 by Missouri Lawyers Weekly.

Liberty Carbon Service, Inc. v. Deborah Lonsinger; and Lonsinger Farms, LLC v. Deborah Lonsinger:

Case Nos. 10 LV-CC00133 and Case No. 10 LV-CC00134 (2011)
Circuit Court of Livingston County, Missouri

I served as sole counsel for the Plaintiffs with regard to stockholder and LLC member derivative actions and petitions for injunctions seeking to recover a combined \$1.18 Million which was wrongfully transferred from company accounts. This case is a good example of the type of corporate or transactional litigation that I have experienced. The key fact and legal issues in this case centered upon the collision of corporate formalities and officer authorities against the actions of a shareholder spouse in anticipation of a divorce. The case resulted in an additional action for the designation of a provisional corporate director and the appointment of a receiver within the companion divorce case, and stipulation to an order returning the funds. This case is an example of the type of unique transaction or corporate litigation that I have handled.

Stephenson, et al. v. Wagoner, et al.:

Case No. 03-CV-693396
Circuit Court of Benton County, Missouri

This is a wrongful death action wherein I was the primary or lead trial counsel for the Plaintiffs, or the surviving family of the deceased. My clients lost their brother when he was in a particularly bad car crash. After initiating suit and bringing forth the evidence we reached a settlement with the defendants' insurance carrier for the full amount of their insurance coverage, or \$500,000.00. This case is an example of the type of personal injury case I have handled.

Matter of Estate of Briscoe

Case No. CV 204-66P
Circuit Court of Clay County, Missouri

I served as sole counsel for the children of a deceased person in a claim against the estate and the personal representative. This case involved the application of inheritance rights by statute, the establishment of paternity between the children and the deceased, and the collection or identification of assets. I was successful in recovering a reasonable inheritance for the two children and settling the estate. This case is an example of the type of contested probate or estate cases that I have handled.

Hometown Hearing & Audiology, Inc. vs. Stewart:

Case No. CV 101-5074 CC (2001)
Circuit Court of Clay County, Missouri

In this case I represented the Plaintiff with regard to a declaratory judgment action and defending counterclaims of a woman claiming to be a shareholder of the company and alleging wage violations. I was sole counsel for the company and the primary legal issue was whether the defendant in fact performed the services necessary to earn a right to receive company stock, the amount of stock to be issued and the validity of the services she claimed to have provided in exchange for the stock. After a fair amount of litigation we were able to reach a mutually satisfactory result through a settlement.

Matter of Moore, 885 S.W.2d 722 (Mo. App. WD 1994)

In this action I represented Clay County, Missouri in the establishment of a guardianship and conservatorship over a person who, although he had an exceptionally high IQ, suffered from serious mental illness. The case involved a week long jury trial and then Mr. Moore, through his attorney, appealed to the Western District wherein the issues on appeal were the sufficiency of evidence and whether evidence taken by the defendant's mother from his home constituted a state action and thus a search and seizure in violation of the 4th Amendment to the Constitution. The Court of Appeals upheld the jury's verdict.

Curnow v. Smith, 111 S.W.3d 569 (Mo. App. W.D. 2003)

This was a continuation of the trial referenced above. After winning a judgment on the question of a whether the defendant personally guaranteed Plaintiff's investment, the defendant appealed on the grounds that the claim was barred by the five-year statute of limitations and not the ten-year statute of limitations. I was sole counsel for Plaintiff on appeal and the Court of Appeals upheld the underlying verdict.

Ballinger v. Rhees and Clay County, 39 S.W.3d 842 (Mo. App. W.D. 2000)

Here I defended Clay County, Missouri against the claim of a plaintiff who claimed that a 20 year old order of child support was illegal entered by the Circuit Court without jurisdiction. The claim included multiple civil rights allegations and challenges seeking to recover child support wrongfully paid to the guardians of the children. I was sole counsel for the County and was able to secure a dismissal of the action prior to trial. The matter was taken up on appeal wherein I briefed and argued the case. The judgment of the trial court was affirmed.

Transactional and Corporate Work: In addition to the litigation portion of my practice, I also have had a large amount of experience in the creation of corporations and limited liability companies whereby I also serve as their general counsel. This work includes a steady amount of contract drafting and review, as well as drafting board minutes and assisting in the conduct of shareholder and board meetings. I have a large amount of experience in stock sale transactions, asset purchase transactions and regulatory compliance with the State. One of the highlight projects of which I was lead counsel was in the development of one of my clients beginning with a three person office in the medical device business (the business and name must remain confidential). Through contract negotiations with manufacturers and acquisitions, the company grew to seven locations in three cities securing more than \$1.5 Million in investment loans. They sold within seven years with the outstanding shareholders receiving roughly \$4 Million for their combined shares. I served as counsel throughout this successful venture and negotiated the purchase contract terms.

Estate Planning: I also have a large amount of experience in drafting of small estate plans, which include Wills, Living Trusts, Testamentary Trusts, and other similar instruments such as durable powers of attorney and healthcare directives. I also provide advice and planning for small businesses and the transfer of company ownership on death.

Key Legislation I Authored, Carried or Significantly Participated In:

HB 191 - Economic Development Tax Incentive Omnibus Bill: In addition to a variety of other economic development bills, I co-authored and carried in 2009 the largest economic development package passed in three legislative years. I worked with labor organizations, community colleges, vocational and technical schools, venture capital associations and the distinctive regional chambers of commerce to develop legislation that increased job training opportunities and capital finance opportunities for job creation, particularly with regard to science and technology related industries. The bill was signed into law in 2009.

HB 393 and SB 1 - Tort Reform and Workers Compensation Legislation: In 2005, I was actively involved in the development of legislation affecting the nature of personal injury claims, damages claims and Worker's Compensation law and procedure. This was hard fought legislation involving serious issues of patient rights, injury victims and protections for doctors, medical providers and injured persons. This experience gave me an expanded base of knowledge regarding these areas of law and the interests of the litigants.

HB 1944 Eminent Domain Reform: In 2006 I served as Vice Chair of the House Judiciary Committee and was closely involved in the drafting and passage of legislation that comprehensively revised Missouri's law and statutory procedures with regard to the use of eminent domain. This legislation followed the U.S. Supreme Court's ruling in the case of *Kelo vs. New London*. This was highly controversial legislation and involved research and understanding of constitutionally preserved property rights, the takings clause of the Missouri and US Constitutions and the due process clause of the 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution. This legislation was signed into law in 2006.

HB 441 Criminal Controlled Substances "Meth": As a member of the Crime and Public Safety Committee I was involved with the drafting and passage of Missouri's first substantial effort to combat meth production. This legislation was signed into law by Governor Blunt and placed new controls on the distribution and sale of compounds containing ephedrine or pseudoephedrine making the same a Schedule V drug. This legislation also criminalized related activities and resulted in a reduction in the number of meth-related crimes in Missouri.





APPLICATION OF TIMOTHY J. FLOOK

Over the last 20 years I have been blessed with a successful private law practice and success as an elected law maker. Serving as a judge in Missouri is to me far more than a job or public service; it is the heart of what makes our nation great. There is a reason why lawyers are respected and riots are rare in the U.S.; it is because most Americans believe in our system of justice. Although our courts do not always rule in the way a person might like, Americans, more so than others, know that their courts are a place where their claims will be heard, their rights can be addressed or the injuries remedied. Our courts provide hope for fairness and a sense of justice.

In my time as an attorney I have had the opportunity to represent criminal defendants, serve in the criminal appeals unit of the Missouri Attorney General, and advocate for a variety of civil litigants in personal injury claims, transactional disputes, and wrongful terminations among others. I have tried criminal and civil jury trials and have experience in drafting jury instructions, preparing pre- and post-trial motions and arguing cases in the Court of Appeals. The diversity of my practice allowed me to learn several subject areas in detail. Some of the notable areas of law wherein I have developed a strong familiarity are employment law, tort law, local government and constitutional law, real estate law, corporate or business transactional rules, injunction actions and equitable claims. In order to properly represent my clients I have had to rise to each challenge and discipline myself to research in new areas of law and regulation. This has made the work of listening and learning part of my daily practice. I believe that an important quality a judge must have is the patience to listen and the willingness to take on difficult challenges in new areas of law and find the answer, or the "justice", in each case. My experience has prepared me for this aspect of serving on the bench.

In addition to my legal experience, I also served six years in the Missouri General Assembly. In that time I worked directly with Democratic and Republican Governors, various Senators and department officials on multiple issues ranging from public safety to economic development, funding of the courts, tax incentives, education standards, administrative law and many other matters. This was a challenging time in my professional life and required much of my personal effort. The reward was working for causes that made a positive difference and increasing my knowledge of law. Most important, I learned well the old adage that "What is popular is not always right, and what is right is not always popular," and that leadership and our system need public servants who are not afraid to remember this maxim and choose the right thing. Making votes on laws and the state budget allowed me to experience what it is like to make controversial decisions in a public setting. I also served on the Joint House-Senate Committee on Administrative Rules, a quasi-judicial body that reviewed proposed regulations of the various state agencies, such as the Department of Insurance, Public Safety or the Gaming Commission. This Committee heard and ruled upon the appeals of often very powerful industry groups and corporations. In this role, I made votes that challenged very powerful interests. This experience helped me to develop an important quality that I believe a judge must have; the ability to be decisive knowing that it will result in both praise and criticism. After being elected three times to the legislature, I did not seek a fourth term. Rather, I chose to follow my

passion and return to the full time practice of law. In a politically divided legislative district, I left office with a public approval rating in excess of 60%.

My life experience is also of importance to my ability to serve well as a judge. My father was a career educator and my mother a hairdresser whose family emigrated from Mexico. I grew up in a suburb where on the outside I fit in quite easily in a community with few immigrants, but in my family life I had regular interaction with immigrants and people who had experienced discrimination in the 30's, 40's and 50's. My simple upbringing has always kept me firmly rooted in the reality that most people's daily lives can be easily dominated in stress or emotion when they must appear in court or resolve a dispute and fairness is what they pray for. I have traveled and studied in Europe and in Mexico and have had the wonderful blessing of making friends and learning different perspectives. These travels have taught me patience and remind me daily that despite differences in race, income, government or other characteristics all individuals are united in their need for the rule of law in their communities and the protection of their rights in a system of courts that does not judge them on their individual traits but rather on the truth of their cause.

My understanding and belief in the important role of our courts is the source of my passion as an attorney and it would be my greatest asset were I to be honored with an appointment as an Associate Circuit Judge.
