In January 2000, while keeping some of the responsibilities of managing partner, I chose not to continue as managing partner so that I could concentrate more on my cases and development of new clients.

In May 2000 I formed a Partnership/LLC with Jeffrey P. Gault, which has allowed me to broaden my practice so as to represent plaintiffs in personal injury litigation and workers' compensation cases, as well as defendants and corporations in the defense of personal injury litigation, including but not limited to automobile accidents, premises liability cases and product liability litigation.

Bryant Moore, Jr., et al. v. Bi-State Development Agency

Facts: The minor plaintiff was dropped off in the dark by defendant Bi-State's bus driver along the edge of a narrow two lane road. There was no shoulder or safe place for him to stand and when he attempted to cross the road, which had a 45 mile per hour speed limit, he was struck by a pickup truck traveling in the opposite direction. The minor plaintiff sustained many serious and disabling injuries, including brain damage resulting in permanent tremors. His medical specials were approximately \$500,000. Represented plaintiff. 13. Party to litigation:

John D. Warner, Jr. v. Pamela Jean (Vickers) Warner, Cause No. 392496, St. Louis County Circuit Court. In this litigation I was divorced from my first wife, Pamela Jean (Vickers) Warner on May 12, 1977. I was the moving party and was awarded custody of our only child, John D. Warner, III, in the decree of dissolution and he has remained in my custody and has been raised by me exclusively until my second marriage in June of 1980, following which my second wife has participated in the raising of my son.

Walter J. Lembeck v. Judge Stephen Limbaugh, et al., Cause No. 84-2947-C-(4), U.S. District Court, Eastern District of Missouri. [Later consolidated with Walter J. Lembeck v. Judge Harry Stussie, et al., Cause No. 84-1721-C-(5)].

In the first Lembeck case filed against Judge Stussie and others, the plaintiff claimed that his civil rights were violated via some form of conspiracy among various judges, attorneys and individuals arising out of a divorce/custody suit between himself and his ex-wife, defendant Linda A. Kaufman, the daughter of Judge Harry J. Stussie.

Kortenhof & Ely and John D. Warner, Jr. entered their appearance on behalf of three of the 60 plus named defendants in the first lawsuit styled Walter J. Lembeck v. Judge Harry Stussie, et al. In December 1984 plaintiff Lembeck filed a second lawsuit styled Walter J. Lembeck v. Judge Stephen Limbaugh, et al. renaming all the defendants in the original suit plus adding as named defendants every attorney and law firm that had entered their appearance on behalf of any other defendants in the first lawsuit, along with naming the federal judge presiding over the first lawsuit as a defendant. After the first federal judge, Stephen Limbaugh, was sued in the second lawsuit, both cases were assigned to the Honorable Judge Clyde S. Cahill.

On January 24, 1986 Judge Cahill entered his order dismissing all defendants from the consolidated cases except Judge Harry Stussie. The plaintiff was granted 20 days within which to file an amended petition stating a cause of action against Judge Stussie. On April 2, 1977 Judge Cahill entered an order dismissing, with prejudice, the only remaining defendant in the case, Judge Stussie.

Following the above disposition of the case, plaintiff filed both an appeal and a petition for declaratory judgment with the Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals. The Eighth Circuit denied the plaintiff's petition for declaratory judgment and dismissed Mr. Lembeck's appeal as frivolous.

On January 19 or 20, 1988 Mr. Lembeck filed a petition for writ of certiorari to the Supreme Court of the United States. On March 21, 1988 the United States Supreme Court denied Mr. Lembeck's petition for writ of certiorari. His petition for rehearing on the writ was also denied.

In Negwer Materials, Inc., et al. v. Korten Hof & Ely, I was sued, along with Korten Hof & Ely, Joseph M. Korten Hof, Ben Ely, Jr., Robert T. Hart, K. Steven Jones, Peter B. Hoffman, John G. Enright, William J. Glaser and Michael R. Swafford, my partners/shareholders, and one former partner/shareholder, as a result of a default judgment that was taken in a case being handled by Ben Ely, Jr. (Please see Sprung v. Negwer Materials, Inc., 775 S.W.2d 97 (Mo.banc 1989)).

I was dismissed from the above lawsuit shortly after it was filed because I was not directly involved in the Sprung case at any time, and I was not a shareholder in Korten Hof & Ely when the default was taken in March of 1985.

17. I have never been disciplined for a breach of ethics or unprofessional conduct. However, I did have a bar complaint filed against me and Gary E. Wiseman of my office by a Mr. Alfred Page.

Alfred Page, a pro se plaintiff and the filer of many lawsuits and claims, two of which were tried in 1990 by the law firm of Kortenhof & Ely, filed a complaint arising out of a case that was litigated successfully by me. After Mr. Page lost his lawsuit, he complained that Gary Wiseman, under my direction, sent a form letter to five fact witnesses identified by Mr. Page, but not listed in the police report, advising these witnesses, who had been subpoenaed by Kortenhof & Ely to appear at trial, that the subpoenas would continue in full force and effect from trial setting to trial setting. Specifically, he complained that by sending this form letter we were interfering with Mr. Page's "personal" fact witnesses to the automobile accident giving rise to the lawsuit.

Mr. Page complained because the very last paragraph of the letter told the witnesses not to come to court until called. This sentence was included in the form letter because lawsuits in the City of St. Louis are tried in numerical sequence but the City subpoena tells the witness to appear on Monday morning of the trial at 9:00 a.m. Obviously, if such a statement advising the witnesses not to show up until they were called was not sent to the witnesses, the witnesses would be compelled by the subpoena to appear every Monday that the case was set for trial and presumably wait at the courthouse until the case was either tried or passed to the next docket.

It should be noted that two out of the five witnesses did appear and testify at trial on behalf of Mr. Page.

The Bar Committee of the Twenty-Second Judicial Circuit determined that there was no reasonable cause for Mr. Page's complaint.

24. Additional data:

Since 1982 when I was licensed to practice law in the State of Missouri, I have handled over 1,000 cases involving premises liability, products liability, automobile accidents, medical malpractice, legal malpractice, civil rights and environmental law. Accordingly, I have a wide range of experience in the trial and handling of lawsuits.

Further, for three years I organized and spoke at a CLE Seminar on Taking and Defending Depositions for UMKC Law School, I have given trial demonstrations at Washington University, and have been a speaker at a CLE on legal malpractice prevention presented by The Bar Plan. I have judged moot court competition at St. Louis University and for the local high school moot court competition. In 1998 I spoke at a Defense Research Institute Seminar on products liability in San Francisco. In May 2003 I was an instructor/participant in a civil jury trial demonstration for the UMKC School of Law.

I have also been a volunteer for Mentor St. Louis for nine years and a volunteer for Legal Services of Eastern Missouri, Inc. for 10-15 years. More recently, I am a volunteer judge for the St. Louis County S.T.A.R. Court Program (Students Toward Academic Responsibility) in the Ferguson/ Florissant School District (formerly Truancy Court), and, while I was elected to the St. Mary Magdalen School Board to serve a three year term from 2004 - 2007, I was elected Vice President of the School Board for the 2005 - 2006 school year and was unanimously elected President of the School Board for the 2006 - 2007 school year, and unanimously asked to remain on the School Board as President for the school year 2007 - 2008. Plus, I am a charter member of The William B. Booth Society (Salvation Army) and I am also a member of the Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital Godparents Society.

Mr. Warner graduated from St. Louis University Law School in 1982 and was engaged in the practice of law at the law firm of Kortenhof & Ely from 1982-2000. In May 2000 he formed a law firm with Jeffrey P. Gault in Clayton, Missouri. The firm represents plaintiffs and defendants in personal injury matters and employees in workers' compensation matters. He is a member of the St. Mary Magdalen parish in Brentwood, Missouri and was unanimously elected to two consecutive terms as President of the St. Mary Magdalen School Board (2006 - 2007 and 2007 - 2008). He is an active participant in the Mentor St. Louis Program and he is a judge in the S.T.A.R. Court Program in the Ferguson/Florissant School District. He is a member of the Missouri and Illinois bar and is also licensed to practice law before the U.S. District Court for the Eastern and Western Districts of Missouri and the Supreme Court of the United States.
