Lane Williams had her driver's license suspended after being arrested for driving while intoxicated following an accident in her private driveway. After a trial de novo, the trial court reinstated Williams's license, and the Director of Revenue appeals.

REVERSED AND REMANDED.

Division Three holds:

There was no dispute at trial that Williams's car was "designed for use" on the highways. While drivers of non-traditional vehicles not designed for use on the highways are subject to the suspension statute only if they actually used the vehicle on the highway, drivers like Williams—driving traditional motor vehicles designed for use on the highway—are subject to suspension under section 302.505 whether the driving occurs on a highway or not.
