Roscoe Green (Defendant) appeals his convictions for first-degree robbery and armed criminal action. Defendant contends the trial court abused its discretion in denying his motion to suppress the robbery victim’s pretrial and in-court identifications of Defendant because the police’s identification procedures were “so suggestive” that they created a substantial likelihood of misidentification.

AFFIRMED.

Division II Holds: The lineup procedures were not impermissibly suggestive. The trial court did not err by denying Defendant’s motion to suppress the victim’s pretrial and in-court identification of Defendant.
