Jon J. Askew appeals the judgment of the Circuit Court of St. Louis County, the Honorable Dale W. Hood, presiding. Askew appeals the trial court’s judgment in favor of CACH, arguing that the court allowed inadmissible hearsay evidence, and without it there was insufficient evidence to demonstrate that CACH was the real-party-in-interest and to support the judgment.

AFFIRMED.

DIVISION ONE HOLDS: The Circuit Court properly admitted the challenged evidence and with it there was sufficient evidence to demonstrate that CACH was the real-party-in-interest and to support the court’s judgment on the theories of breach of contract and account stated. Additionally, as Askew failed to establish any violations of the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act by CACH in its collection efforts, he is not entitled to any recovery under the Act.
