Cindy Irene Young (Defendant) appeals from a judgment entered in the Ralls County Circuit Court following her conviction for identity theft. Defendant contends that the trial court abused its discretion by admitting evidence of uncharged crimes.

AFFIRMED.

Division Four Holds: The trial court did not abuse its discretion by admitting into evidence: (1) the victim's testimony that Defendant committed the uncharged crimes of entering into the victim's house without permission, stealing his personal papers, and placing offensive stickers on several objects; (2) copies of the vehicle titles allegedly stolen during the unlawful entry; and (3) a copy of the stickers allegedly placed on several objects in the victim's home. Such evidence was logically relevant in that it presented a complete and coherent picture of the events that transpired and, in the case of the stickers, evidenced Defendant's motive for stealing the victim's identity.
