**OPINION SUMMARY**

Anheuser-Busch, Inc. ("A-B"), Terry Kaelin, Rick Marberry,<sup>1</sup> and Nancy Lux<sup>2</sup> (collectively "Defendants") appeal the trial court's judgment denying their motion to compel arbitration in the employment discrimination suit filed by Alisha Marzette and Kathy Dunmire (collectively "Plaintiffs").

AFFIRMED.

Division Four holds:

Plaintiffs' alleged agreements to submit claims against A-B to binding arbitration are not supported by consideration. Therefore, the trial court did not err in denying Defendants' motion to compel arbitration.
