Jody Valentine (“Husband”) appeals from the trial court’s judgment dissolving his marriage to Christine Valentine (“Wife”). Husband raises eleven points of error on appeal concerning the award of maintenance, the distribution of marital and nonmarital property, the trial court’s finding that he dissipated certain marital funds, the award of custody, the residential-parent determination, the award of child support, and the grant of Wife’s attorney’s fees.

REVERSED AND REMANDED.

Division Five Holds: The trial court erred in awarding maintenance because it failed to consider whether Wife could provide for her reasonable needs through use of the marital property apportioned her in the dissolution, as is required by Section 452.335.1 RSMo (2000). See *Schubert v. Schubert*, 366 S.W.3d 55, 64-65 (Mo. App. E.D. 2012). In all other respects, the trial court did not err.
