Sean Hibler appeals the judgment entered upon a jury verdict convicting him of one count of unlawful use of a weapon, section 571.030, RSMo (Cum. Supp. 2011). In his sole point on appeal, Hibler contends the trial court erred in denying his motion for judgment of acquittal because the evidence was insufficient to prove that he acted with the required mental culpability when he shot into a dwelling house.

AFFIRMED.

DIVISION FOUR HOLDS: We affirm. The evidence adduced at trial was sufficient for a reasonable juror to infer that Hibler acted knowingly when he discharged his firearm into a dwelling house.
