Deborah Leimkuhler, an employee of the United States Postal Service, filed a petition against her co-worker, Cheryl Gordon, for an order of protection under the Adult Abuse Act. Leimkuhler pleaded that Gordon abused her and stalked her. The court issued a judgment and full order of protection finding that there had been both abuse and stalking. Gordon appeals.

REMANDED WITH INSTRUCTIONS.

Division One holds:

Because the full order of protection has expired, and nothing we can do will affect the legal relations between the parties, the matter has become moot.
