Lisa Shinkle appeals her conviction on two counts of receiving stolen property in violation of Section 570.080. The stolen property was a male monkey and a female monkey, both of which were recovered at Shinkle's home. Shinkle contends the trial court erred in entering judgment on the convictions because: (1) the evidence was insufficient to prove that she knew the monkeys were stolen; and (2) the two convictions subjected her to multiple punishments for a single act of receiving stolen property and thereby violated her constitutional right to be free from double jeopardy.

**AFFIRMED.**

Division IV holds: (1) the evidence of Shinkle's efforts to conceal the location and the identity of the monkeys was sufficient to prove that she knew they had been stolen; and (2) Shinkle failed to plead or raise double jeopardy as an

affirmative defense and, therefore, waived that constitutional claim. The convictions are affirmed.
