D.L. Pollard (Husband) appeals the circuit court's judgment dissolving his marriage to Margaret A. Pollard (Wife). Husband contends that the court erred in its classification of a bank account as non-marital, erred in its classification of a 1919 Studebaker as marital, erred by not classifying some property at all, erred by not designating values to all of the property, erred in its division and award of property, and erred by not dividing the marital debt. We dismiss without addressing the merits of these claims. Because the circuit court failed to address and distribute marital debt, the court's judgment is neither final nor appealable.
