William Douglas Loggins appeals, following a jury trial, his convictions of first-degree burglary and stealing, for which he was sentenced to a total of ten years' imprisonment. Loggins challenges only the sufficiency of the evidence supporting the burglary conviction—specifically, the element of unlawful entry.

**AFFIRMED.**

**Division One holds:**

1. With respect to public places, a person who, regardless of his purpose, enters or remains does so with license and privilege unless he defies a lawful order not to enter or remain, personally communicated to him by the owner of such premises or by other authorized person.
2. Wal-Mart revoked Loggins's license when it issued him a Notice of Restriction from Property, advising him that he was no longer allowed on Wal-Mart property unless notified otherwise.

3. There was no evidence that Wal-Mart ever rescinded the restriction; thus, Loggins's entry into the Wal-Mart store was unlawful.
