Gross income adjusted for

- SSA Title II benefits paid for child due to disabled or retired parent however benefits received for blind or disabled children may be applied against the obligor's month CSO minus adjustments for child care and other contributions***
- There is also an adjustment for "court ordered monthly adjustment for marital **debt**"
- Adjustment for child support actually paid for other families and alimony paid from prior case
- Adjustment to income for number of "in home children excluding children in case
- Child care deduction requires RECEIPTS **
- If TANF/AFDC provided there are adjustments for number of children receiving OKDHS subsidy and number of children included in child support
- Effective July 1, 2009, the Oklahoma child support guidelines law has been amended, see Title 43 Sections 118 through 118I of the Oklahoma statutes. The new state law complies with new federal law for establishment of meaningful medical support orders for minor children in child support orders, see 42 U.S.C. Section 652(f); 666(a)(19)(A) and 45 C.F.R. Sections 302.56; 303.31; 303.32.
- The child support computation form is the legal document used to calculate the child support obligation for a noncustodial parent (obligor) due on or after July 1, 2009, as required pursuant to Section 120 of Title 43 of the Oklahoma statutes. The form must be signed by the judge and attached as an exhibit to orders which establish or modify a child support obligation.

- Split custody is done like our state.
- There is now a parenting time adjustment (part B to the calculations). There is a to part form (Part A is the base MSO and part B is the parenting time adjustment). Oklahoma calculates the parent with the greatest financial obligation to be the obligor.*****
- Third party custodians require two calculations and each parent pays third party.
- Passive income included including parents SS benefits.
- Self-employment income is reduced by 7.65% for the parent's contributions to self-employment tax **** (automatic)

- **Excluded from income:** employer contributions to health insurance or retirement of pension plans, child support for children not in front of court; adoption assistance subsidy (**); means-tested public benefits including TANF, SSI, nutrition assistant (food stamps) and payments for blind and disabled parents; income of the children from any source including SSD for disabled children and payments receive by the parent for care of foster children

Parenting time adjustment: The **noncustodial parent spends at least 121 overnights with the child(ren) over a 12 month period; or On a case with multiple children, the parent seeking the parenting time adjustment spends a different amount of time with each child.**

- Per 43 O.S. Section 118A: "**Overnight** means the child is in the physical custody and control of a parent for an overnight period of at least **twelve (12) hours**, and that parent has made a reasonable expenditure of resources for the care of the child." (see instructions—very detailed)
