Snipes & Ley, PC. Oklahoma City, OK, 1984-1986. I was an administrative assistant for the partners of the firm. In addition to my duties supporting the partners in their day to day practices I aided in the preparation of tax forms for submission to the various taxing authorities as well as handling client files and client communications. I left to accept a job in the accounting office of a large commercial construction company.

Yordi Construction Inc., Oklahoma City, OK, 1986-1987. I took a job with the construction company in the accounting department. I was responsible for the accounts payables for the commercial construction operations. I was transferred to the Fort Worth, Texas office and continued to handle the accounts payable for the Texas operations. I left for an opportunity to be an accounting manager at another company.

Lestek Manufacturing Inc., Fort Worth, TX, 1987-1988. I was an accounting manager for this company that manufactured high output alternators. The company was sold and I left for a lateral move to JPI Inc.

JPI, Inc., Fort Worth, TX, 1988-1990. I was an accounting manager for this HVAC company. I resigned to go to law school in Oklahoma.

Paul Harris Inc., Oklahoma City, OK, 1991-1993. I was a sales person in this clothing store while I attended law school in Oklahoma City. I left upon my graduation from law school in May 1993.

I moved to Christiansted, St. Croix, United States Virgin Islands ("USVI") upon graduating from law school and sat for the USVI bar in July 1993. I passed the bar exam at that time.

Joel Holt, Esquire, Christiansted, St. Croix, USVI, 1993. I worked for Mr. Holt as a law clerk while I studied for the USVI bar exam.

Legal Services of the Virgin Islands, Christiansted, St. Croix, USVI, 1993. I provided assistance to attorneys and clients as it related to their legal matters, primarily domestic relations cases. This was a volunteer position.

Hunter, Colianni, Cole & Turner, Christiansted, St. Croix, USVI, 1994. I worked primarily with partner Rick Hunter in preparation of research briefs in transactional matters and pending civil litigation.

My then husband's job transferred us to St. Thomas in 1995. In 1995 the island was hit by three hurricanes, Marilyn being a direct hit and the most severe. We left the island shortly thereafter in 1995 and moved to St. Louis Missouri to live with family.

Robert Half Inc., St. Louis, MO, 1995-1996. I worked with a temporary accounting agency while I sat for the Missouri bar and began to look for employment in the legal field.

Catholic Charities, St. Louis, MO, 1996. I worked as an attorney for indigents in domestic relations matters. This was a short term

assignment while the regular attorney was out for medical reasons.

Volunteer Lawyers Program with Eastern Missouri Legal Services, St. Louis, MO 1996. I represented indigent men and women in different types of legal matters such as dissolution of marriage, landlord tenant issues and collections. This was fairly soon after the flood of 1993 and low income people had been greatly affected with no resources to rebound. In addition to legal services, we provided information and guidance in helping individuals apply for state aid, federal aid, charitable and non-profit aid. It was a very rewarding and humbling experience.

Volunteered with Advocates For Abused Women Organization, St. Louis, MO, 1996. Represented women who were victims of domestic violence and helped them with orders of protection, obtaining safe shelter, and providing information regarding their rights as victims.

Missouri State Public Defender System, 1996-1998, Joplin, Missouri and 1998-2000 in the City of St. Louis. I was hired as a trial attorney and worked in Jasper County until I transferred to St. Louis in 1998 and continued to try cases. While employed with the Public Defenders Office I tried twelve jury trials and second-chaired an additional ten trials. In 2000, I resigned with the intent of opening my own law practice, however, I was offered a position by my prior Public Defender team leader who was now working for Cordell and Cordell. I was excited to work with her again. Cordell and Cordell offered me a job which I accepted.

Cordell and Cordell, P.C., St. Louis, Missouri, 2000-2001; Kansas City, Missouri 2001-2003, 2005-2007. I accepted an associate position in the firm which solely represents men in domestic relations litigation. I was asked after 9 months to move to Kansas City and open an office for the firm there. I was the managing attorney for the Kansas City office until 2003 when I left to open my own practice with two attorneys in Liberty, Missouri. In 2005 I was asked to come back to Cordell & Cordell by the then managing attorney. I stayed until 2007 at which time I reopened my own law practice.

Law Office of Christie Sherman, Liberty, MO, Platte City, MO and

Kansas City, MO, 2007 – 2009. I had my own legal practice concentrating on men’s rights litigation in domestic relations. I closed my practice to work with my husband, Mark Jess, in his plaintiff’s employment law practice, Employee Rights Law Firm.

Employee Rights Law Firm, Kansas City, MO, 2009 – present. I am a partner in the firm. We represent employees in cases of discrimination and retaliation. I have tried two jury trials with Mark since 2009. In addition, I have continued to represent individuals in domestic relations matters as well as representing biological parents in appointed juvenile matters in Jackson County, Missouri.

12. Describe the nature and extent of your experience as a practicing attorney in the trial and appellate courts, and explain how such experience demonstrates the quality of your legal work.

I have been practicing for 17 years and my legal experience has ranged from civil and domestic to criminal matters. While I was a public defender for the State of Missouri I had to handle a high-volume caseload. While in the Jasper County office, I handled between 150-200 cases at a time. I was the public defender that handled the entire public defender felony case-load through preliminary hearing. I worked with the court personnel, the sheriff’s department, the prosecuting attorney, as well as the family members of defendants and primarily the defendants themselves whose cases were being heard. I learned the importance of being effective yet efficient, balancing the needs of my client with the court’s need to keep the docket moving. I also had the pleasure of being a public defender in the City of St. Louis and the differences between the two settings, rural and urban, helped me to appreciate the value of diversity. Ultimately, I learned from my mentors such as Judge Copeland and Judge Dermot to be courteous yet firm, to listen and to demand respect of the judicial process.

After six years doing criminal defense work, I began a domestic relations practice, both in a law firm setting and as a sole practitioner. I have learned that litigants that come before a judge will likely be coming at a time in which they are dealing with many stressors and may not be at their best. This requires on the part of the court and the attorneys to be cognizant of this fact and treat litigants with some patience and to listen intently to their story as it is told at trial. While in

my domestic relations practice I learned that my role as counselor was equally if not more important than the role of advocate. I learned that a domestic relations docket is most efficiently run when a judge is consistent in his/her decisions and attorneys can discuss and make decisions with their clients based on that consistency.

While working as a sole practitioner, I learned a great deal about time management, organization and efficiency. I have worked with many wonderful and talented lawyers from whom I learned so much about the practice of law, especially that it should be viewed not as a business but as a profession. I learned that courtesy in the courtroom and in dealings with opposing counsel is paramount to the process working smoothly and to cutting down on unnecessary motions and/or litigiousness.

I have been the sole attorney in twelve criminal jury trials, second chaired ten criminal jury trials and second chaired two civil employment law jury trials. I have been the sole attorney on numerous bench trials including criminal, adult abuse, collections, domestic relations, juvenile, and civil matters. I have argued before the Missouri Western District Court of Appeals and have practiced in 29 counties in the state of Missouri as well as the City of St. Louis. In my 17 years of practice before so many judges in so many circuits, I have had the opportunity to observe and learn the traits that I believe help make an effective judge: decisiveness, being even-tempered, having a willingness to learn, remaining neutral, following the rule of law and being consistent.

I have attempted to obtain information regarding the specifics of all of the jury trials in which I was the primary attorney. Unfortunately, after contacting the Supreme Court Administrator and the Public Defenders Office in Jefferson City, the only records that could be located due to the time that has lapsed since the cases were tried are provided below.

State of Missouri v. Danny Baker, CR496-1043M – This case was tried in the Circuit Court of Jasper County, Missouri in 1996. I represented Mr. Baker in a misdemeanor assault case in which we were able to obtain a not guilty verdict.

State of Missouri v. Troy Carter, CR597-3423FX – This case was tried in the Circuit Court of Jasper County, Missouri in 1997. I represented Mr. Carter in a felony possession of a controlled substance case in which Mr. Carter was found guilty and sentenced to 5 years in the Missouri Department of Corrections. Mr. Carter had a prior conviction for a similar offense and did not testify.

State of Missouri v. James Bailey, CR597-2260FX – This case was tried in the Circuit Court of Jasper County, Missouri in 1997. I represented Mr. Bailey in a felony possession of a controlled substance case in which we were able to obtain a not guilty verdict.

State of Missouri v. Gay Pedersen, CR297-525FX – This case was tried in the Circuit Court of McDonald County, Missouri in 1997. I represented Ms. Pedersen in a felony possession of a controlled substance case in which we were able to obtain a not guilty verdict.

State of Missouri v. Anthony Mitchell, CR598-1215FX – This case was tried in the Circuit Court of Jasper County, Missouri in 1998. I represented Mr. Mitchell in a felony possession of a controlled substance case in which we were able to obtain a not guilty verdict.

Michael Barnes v. Nell Barnes, 0716-FC01735 – This case was tried in the Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri in 2007. I represented Mr. Barnes in dissolution of marriage action. This was an unusual case in which the children were both over the age of 21 but mentally disabled. In addition, the oldest child was the ward of an estate through probate court in which both his parents were his appointed guardians and conservators.

Tracy Barrow v. Laurie Barrow, 05AE-CY03963-00 and 05AE-CY03963-01. These cases were tried in the Circuit Court of Platte

County, Missouri beginning in 2005 with a dissolution of marriage action and subsequent modification action in 2008. I represented Mr. Barrow in both matters. These cases involved high conflict custody matters in which multiple experts were used by both parties, a guardian *ad litem* was appointed in both cases, false allegations of abuse were alleged by Respondent and allegations of alienation of affection were presented by my client. The court ultimately found that the mother's allegations of abuse were false and that she, in fact, was responsible for the alienation of affection between my client and the children.

Nancy Asheton Blair v. William Jeremy Blair, 01CV-84655-02. This case was tried in the Circuit Court of Platte County, Missouri in 2004. I represented Mr. Blair in this modification of a dissolution of marriage action. The main focus of this litigation was financial in nature, as Mr. Blair filed his motion to modify to have his maintenance obligation terminated due to Ms. Asheton Blair having access to a family trust which had a substantial monetary value and which Ms. Asheton Blair accessed for her own use.

Christina Daniel v. John Timothy Daniel, 03F-209585. This case was tried in the Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri in 2004. I represented Mr. Daniel in this dissolution of marriage action. This was an interesting case in which the parties lived in different countries, one in the United States and one in Germany. Both parties petitioned the court for full custody. Ultimately the court divided the children and placed one child with the father and one child with the mother.

Richard Pollard v. Anne Brown Pollard, 04CV85203-01, 04CV85203-02 and 04CV85203-03. These cases were tried in the Circuit Court of Platte County, Missouri in 2006, 2007 and 2010. I represented Mr. Pollard in all three matters. These cases were all modification of dissolution of marriage actions. These cases involved high conflict custody matters in which multiple experts were used by both parties, a guardian *ad litem* was appointed in two of the cases, false allegations of abuse were alleged by Respondent and allegations of alienation of affection were presented by Petitioner, Mr. Pollard.

Loraine Jenkins v. Paul Austin, WD68302 – Missouri Western District Court of Appeals. This appeal was filed by Petitioner in 2007. The original case was a paternity action in which Petitioner appealed the lower court's order to change the child's name at the request of the father. Petitioner alleged that the court did not have jurisdiction to change the name of a child if the request did not come from the mother as father did not have standing to make such a request. This case was submitted after oral argument was heard. The Court of Appeals upheld the lower court's ruling.




