Kathleen M. Vaughn appeals the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission's decision denying her claim for unemployment benefits. Vaughn filed a claim following a layoff from one of her two part time jobs. Vaughn asserts the Commission failed to consider her reduction in wages as a result of her layoff. Vaughn also asserts the Commission erred in finding her unavailable for work after she requested to not be scheduled at her other job.

AFFIRMED.

<u>Division One Holds</u>: The Commission did not err in denying Vaughn's claim. After Vaughn was laid off, she requested not to be scheduled at CVS. Through this act, Vaughn divorced herself from the entire labor market and rendered herself unavailable to work. Vaughn failed to prove her entitlement to unemployment benefits regardless of her reduction in wages following her layoff.
