Ronald Lamy appeals from the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission's final award denying his February 2017 claim seeking workers' compensation benefits for a repetitive injury to his left wrist. Lamy argues that the Commission erred in concluding it had no jurisdiction to consider Lamy's February 2017 claim because it was covered by the compromise settlement of an August 2016 claim for workers' compensation benefits for a repetitive injury to Lamy's left upper extremity.

### AFFIRMED.

#### **Division Three holds:**

Lamy's August 2016 workers' compensation claim concerned a repetitive injury to Lamy's "left upper extremity." When Lamy entered into a compromise settlement with his employer for the August 2016 workers' compensation claim, Lamy had a known repetitive injury to his left wrist (a portion of his left upper extremity). The compromise settlement exhausted the Commission's jurisdiction to entertain Lamy's subsequent February 2017 claim seeking workers' compensation benefits for a repetitive injury to the left wrist.
