# **Descriptions of Table Headings:**

Type - Ordinance violations are designated as "Ord".

MO Charge Code - The charge code number assigned to a particular offense.

The manual also lists a one digit state modifier (0 - no modifier, 1 - attempt, 2 - accessory) following the decimal point. The modifiers are used by prosecutors and law enforcement personnel to communicate additional information related to the offense charged in a particular case.

NCIC Code - The 4-digit code used by law enforcement to report offenses to the National Crime Information Center.

**F/P OCN -** Fingerprint / Offense Cycle Number: Yes= Fingerprint required, No= Fingerprint not required.

• Courts Using SMC use the following case types :

- o Ordinance= O1, O2, O7 and O8 County Ordinance Courts only
- o Ordinance= O3, O4, O5 or O6 Ordinance Municipal Divisions
- Courts Not Using SMC :
  - o Ordinance report as the appropriate case type on the Monthly Municipal Division Summary Reporting form

**Case Type** - O = Ordinance. "Case Type" is used by OSCA to categorize various cases for management purposes. **Note: If you need case type for statistical purposes, please see the Municipal Codes with COR 8 and Excess Revenue Indicator document posted on CIC. ROC?** - Record of Conviction: Submit to Dept of Revenue - Y = Yes, N = No, and \* = Reportable if offense involves a motor vehicle. **Effective Date** - Indicates the begin date for a charge code.
