I am excited to apply for the position of Associate Circuit Judge for the 21st Judicial Circuit. I came to the United States from Jamaica as a child and was excited to be part of my new country. As I studied the history and government of the United States I became aware of the rights I enjoyed in the United States and I became a citizen in 1997.

I have always tried to maintain high standards of personal conduct. Those standards developed in my childhood and stayed with me as I earned my bachelor and law degrees. As a child, I was always considered to be patient and opened minded. I did not realize then that those qualities would serve me well in my professional life. A childhood friend challenged me to attend law school and become an attorney. While I never planned on becoming an attorney, the choice has been a good one. Once in

law school I soon realized that I was excited to be an attorney. That excitement did not end with my studies, but continued into my work in indigent public defense. Working for the Missouri State Public Defender has taught me to be fair, respectful and humble. I have had countless encounters with clients who need someone to listen to their concerns, counsel them on their choices and guide them through a complex legal system. I believe I have been successful in my work because I have treated both those clients, and all with whom I have come into contact in the judicial system, fairly. Those same qualities are essential for any person to advance in our legal system especially to become a judge.
