I have been on the bench in St. Louis County Circuit Court for just under eighteen years. As a Family Court Commissioner in Division 61, my caseload averaged nearly 500 cases at any given time. I heard juvenile law matters including child abuse and neglect, juvenile delinquency, guardianship of minors and termination of parental rights. In addition, I heard domestic relations matters including dissolutions, motions to modify, paternity and adult abuse. During my tenure as Family Court Commissioner, I presided over more than 400 trials. I currently serve as a Traffic Commissioner in Division 46. My docket consists of just over 800 trial de novo and petition for review cases arising from Missouri Department of Revenue license revocations. I hear trials weekly on DWI arrests involving breath testing, refusals to take a breath test, 10-year revocation reinstatement requests, point revocations, commercial driver's license revocations, fraud in application cases and Metrolink citation cases. During my tenure as Traffic Commissioner I have presided over more than 300 trials.

During the five years prior to my initial appointment to the bench, I served the St. Louis County Family Court first as a guardian ad litem while in private practice and then as a staff attorney for the Family Court. I tried hundreds of cases involving serious criminal charges against juveniles, abuse and neglect charges against parents, termination of parental rights cases as well as representing juvenile officers in detention hearings and certification hearings.

I have worked in the St. Louis County Circuit Court system for the past twenty-three years
both as an attorney and as a judicial officer. I have represented private clients, as well as the
court, in both civil and criminal matters. As a Commissioner in the 21st circuit I have handled
some of the most serious dockets in our circuit. I have interfaced with prosecuting attorneys,
law enforcement, probation officers, deputy juvenile officers, social service workers,
treatment providers, members of the private bar, legislators, courthouse staff, judges, pro se
litigants and lay witnesses. I have been called upon in the past to help create and implement a
Sexual Offender Task Force within our juvenile court. As a leader of that team I met with
and worked collaboratively with law enforcement agencies, juvenile officers and treatment
providers to establish guidelines and consistency in the handling of such matters. I was also
the designated judicial officer for such dockets during my tenure as Family Court
Commissioner. I have been an active member of our judiciary in the community. I routinely
speak to school and church groups about the judicial system and legal system in general. I
have hosted school groups at the St. Louis County Courthouse on field trips. I am active in
