As a practicing attorney, I have dedicated the majority of my career to public service. In 1987, I began my professional career as a trial attorney for the office of the Public Defender. I appeared in court and began to develop and hone my skills daily. I handled hundreds of cases where I learned the art of negotiating pleas and conducting depositions, bench, and jury trials. In 1990, I entered private practice where I continued to polish my skills handling both civil and criminal cases. In 1993, I returned to public service as an Assistant Circuit Attorney.

As a prosecutor, I became intensely aware of the importance of public service and how it impacts our community. I also learned of the drain crime has on the victims and the community, in general. During my eleven years as prosecutor, I have had numerous trials, reviewed, and handled hundreds of cases. My duties consisted of trials, conducting hearings, ranging from preliminary hearings, motions to suppress, and post-conviction relief motions. I developed a reputation as a competent, ethical, and a fair trial attorney.

As an Assistant Circuit Attorney, I was promoted to the Homicide Unit. In this unit, I learned to communicate with persons touched by horrific crime and communicate with them in a way that made them feel comfortable about participating in the criminal justice process. I tried very complex cases and was presented with an Appreciation Award for services rendered from the homicide unit of the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department. In 2000, I was promoted to trial team leader.

As trial team leader, I supervised, trained, and oversaw the trial docket management of approximately five attorneys. While supervising junior attorneys, I maintained daily a docket of over thirty class A and B felony cases, as well as reviewed hundreds of cases for filing. It was during this period, I developed my administrative and managerial skills. In addition to trial responsibilities, I also held director positions for both the Internship and the Minority Recruitment Programs of the Circuit Attorney Office. Upon leaving the Office of the Circuit Attorney, I was presented with the prestigious outstanding trial attorney ranking and award.

As an Associate Circuit Judge, I have handled both civil and criminal dockets, including presiding over numerous felony cases. I have also presided over the Division 16 assignment docket for the Circuit Court. In an effort to relieve a case backlog, I served as a volunteer Judge for St. Louis County for three weeks in 2011. During two separate terms I presided over seventy (70) jury trials, and conducted numerous hearings and pleas. I also heard civil jury trial matters transferred from Division 29. In my current assignment in Division 25, I have implemented a new pre-trial supervision program utilizing GPS technology, designed to monitor persons who have made bond while awaiting trial. I was appointed to the special committee reviewing bonding procedures for the Bond Commissioner's Office. I am currently serving on the Public Education and Drug Court Committees and have previously served on the Personnel, and the Presiding Judge Advisory Committees.

In addition to my judicial duties, I participate in the St. Louis University School of Law Externship Program exposing law students to the legal process, as well as internship programs for Webster University and Sanford Brown College. I also continue to be an adjunct professor at Webster University in the Legal Studies Program.

Parties appeared to argue defendant's motion to set aside guilty pleas from 2002 and 2005, pursuant to Rule 29.07 (d).
