After her appointment to the bench, Judge Reno volunteered as a Truancy Court Judge in the St. Louis County Truancy Court Program (a program to encourage school attendance).

Prior to her appointment to the bench, Judge Reno was a member of The Hale Law Firm. Her experience covered all phases of civil, and criminal litigation, at the state and federal levels.
