Appendix Question 10

a) Appellate Experience

I handled the briefing and arguing of approximately 26 appeals for clients and four amicus curiae briefs. A list of those cases is attached as Appendix 10(a). The most significant included:

- (1) *Strahler v. St. Luke's Hosp.*, 706 S.W.2d 7 (Mo. banc 1986). The hospital was represented by Larry McMullen. I had full briefing responsibilities and argued the case to the Supreme Court. The case involved the constitutionality of the medical malpractice statute of limitations as applied to a minor. The court agreed that the statute was unconstitutional because other laws barred the minor from bringing an action in his or her own name.
- (2) *Wessar v. John Chezik Motors*, 623 S.W.2d 599 (Mo.App. 1981). Chezik was represented by Jack Olson. I had full briefing and argument responsibilities. This case involved the admissibility of expert testimony as to whether a motorcycle salesman acted negligently in instructing a prospective female purchaser how to ride a motorcycle.
- (3) *Alpine Electric Co. v. Union Bank*, 979 F.2d 133 (8th Cir. 1992). The bank was represented by Bob Raymond. This case involved a claim under the Bank Holding Company Act (mini antitrust act applying only to national banks). I did all briefing and argument.
- (4) *Manar v. Park Lane Medical Center*, 653 S.W.2d 310 (Mo.App.1988). Opposing Counsel was Ted Furry. This case involved the issue of whether the release of an agent by settlement released the principal. I handled all aspects.

b) Trial-Level Experience

I have no records of non-jury cases that I tried but am certain they number over one hundred. I tried approximately 20 jury cases as either lead counsel or co-counsel with significant responsibility. A complete list is attached as Appendix 10(b). They include:

- (1) *Wilson v. PPG* (Jackson County approximately 1993). I represented Wilson in a product liability claim against Pittsburgh Plate Glass represented by Joe Sherman. A 6 day trial resulted in a plaintiff's verdict.
- (2) *Richardson v. Volkswagen* (Greene County). I co-represented Richardson in an auto crashworthiness case against Volkswagen, which was represented by Jack Kilroy. A six-week trial resulted in a plaintiff's verdict.

- (3) *Murphy v. LeCompte* (City of St. Louis). I represented a small business that was being sued for false arrest. John Allyn represented the plaintiff. Plaintiff received a verdict that was surprisingly small.
- (4) *Janner v. Farmers Insurance*, (Jackson County). I represented an insured whose Jaguar was destroyed in a fire while at a garage. His own insurer, represented by Dick Heilbron, offered only about half the claimed value. A three-day trial resulted in a verdict for plaintiff including vexatious delay damages. Farmers paid the verdict without filing a motion for new trial.

c) Judicial Experience

I was a circuit court judge in Jackson County from 1995 to 2000. During that time, I heard virtually every type of case. Exact case statistics for that time are not available because of an incomplete computer conversion. Internal records show that I tried 49 jury cases, 36 court-tried cases, 77 domestic cases, 191 termination of parental rights cases, 143 certifications of juveniles to stand trial as adults, and approximately 500 delinquency cases. No records of guilty pleas are available but I took over 400 guilty pleas in one six-month period and certainly hundreds more during my tenure. Records also do not show the number of probation revocations and post conviction remedy cases, which also would have numbered in the hundreds. I served as the Criminal Assignment judge and the Family Court Administrative and Juvenile judge during my tenure.

I was appointed to the Court of Appeals in 2000 and remain in that position. During that time, I have sat on divisional or en banc panels in over 1200 cases. I have authored approximately 316 opinions as an appellate judge, including concurring and dissenting opinions. I have also sat by designation with the Supreme Court on five occasions.
