12. Describe the nature and extent of your experience as a practicing attorney in the trial and appellate courts, and explain how such experience demonstrates the quality of your legal work.

My experience as a practicing attorney began as an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney under
Albert Riederer and I remained in the office when Claire McCaskill was elected to the

position. My duties ranged from prosecuting and collecting child support payments, bringing paternity suits, prosecuting all criminal cases through trial ranging from stealing, burglary, robbery, rape, assault and murder; filing all cases including a time assigned to the violent crimes division of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department. Administrative duties included running trial teams, the warrant desk, the criminal trial division and state lobbyist.

I have been in private practice since 1997 focusing on workers compensation, criminal defense, business litigation and personal injury claims.

I served as the Secretary/Attorney and Assistant Secretary/Attorney and Business Manager for the Kansas City Board of Police Commissioners. My duties as Secretary/Attorney included attendance at all Board meetings, advising the Board on liability issues and Sunshine Law matters, defending the Board in certain suits brought against the body, acting as a liaison with various department units and other city agencies and overseeing certain disciplinary hearings. I also initiated and oversaw a program whereby the Office of Community Complaints (OCC) and the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department worked through differences associated with recommendations for the discipline of police officers in cases investigated by OCC.

For Approximately seven (7) years I have served and continue to serve as the appointed Judge for the city of Peculiar.

In re the Estate of George W. Mansfield, Jr. No. 05PR00928. This was a probate matter in the District Court of Johnson County, Kansas where I was admitted for this case *pro hac vice*. I represented the Estate's Personal Representative against claims for her removal made by heirs of the Estate who happened to be the Personal Representative's sisters. The Personal Representative was not removed and the matter was ultimately resolved through a Settlement Agreement. The matter was tried to a judge.

A & A Lock and Key, L.L.C., 08CY-CV05326. Breach of Contract, Quantum Meruit and Foreclosure of Mechanics Lien case from Clay County, Missouri involving the remodeling of a convenience store. I represented A & A Lock & Key, L.L.C., the contractor who was awarded its full request for damages in this Judge tried matter. Judgment entered March 10, 2010.

State of Missouri v. Peter Ralls, CR93-4990. (Drug Trafficking) Precursor to prosecution of same defendant for charge of Murder in the Second Degree. Defendant was found guilty on June 30, 1994).

State of Missouri v. Peter Ralls, CR93-4343. (Murder in the Second Degree and Armed

Criminal Action) This case is significant for a number of reasons including the fact that the defendant provided an inmate at the county jail with a letter seeking to have a witness killed and that one of the chief witnesses for the state murdered his girlfriend on the Friday preceding the start of trial on Monday and was therefore unavailable for trial in this matter. Defendant was found guilty of all count on August 11, 1994.

Glazer v. Glazer, et al. 16CV98-13432. Case involving the local Comedy Club entrepreneurs for breach of contract pitting father against sons. My client was the plaintiff, Stanford Glazer, the father, and Judgment was entered against him on September 1, 2000.

State of Missouri v. Arthur Williams, CR91-3514. (Robbery in the First Degree, Armed Criminal Action and Kidnapping) This case is significant for the sheer brutality of the facts involved and that the jury found the Defendant guilty and imposed sentences exactly as requested during closing argument. Defendant was found guilty on July 15, 1992.

Lewis et al. v. RFF Development Co., et al., Case No. 08CA-CV04108. Pending matter with three (3) defendants. Extensive discovery in progress. Claims include property damage, negligence per se, negligence, inverse condemnation, merchandising practices act violations and fraud.

Steve Dubinsky v. St. Louis Blues (See description under appellate cases, below) Missouri Division of Workers Compensation and Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

Central McClellion v. Kansas City Chiefs (See description under appellate cases, below) Missouri Division of Workers Compensation and Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

NFL Concussion Litigation Cases Lawsuits being brought on behalf of various former NFL players involving concussions and the long-term effects such are having on the health of the plaintiffs. These matters are being handled with co-counsel and various counsel across the United States.

8th Circuit Court of Appeals

United States of America v. Lopes 95-3622 WMS. I was appointed to handle the appeal of the criminal conviction of Mr. Lopes. The primary issue in this matter was the application of the sentencing guidelines to the defendant and his offenses. I wrote the entire brief and argued the appeal.

Darby v. Weishar, et al., Appeal No. 01-2006. Appeal of an employment discrimination matter involving members of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department. The matter was tried to a jury and this appeal by the Plaintiff followed. I represented the individual defendants at trial and in this appeal. I wrote the brief and it was submitted on the briefs and not argued. Major issues involved Eleventh Amendment Immunity and evidentiary matters surrounding the plaintiff's claims.

Missouri Court of Appeals, Eastern District

Dubinsky v. the St. Louis Blues Hockey Team: No. ED88767: 229 S.W.3d 126 (Mo.App.E.D. 2007). In a case of first impression, the primary point of the appeal was to challenge the constitutionality of Sec. 287.270 RSMo., involving the credit given the employers of professional athletes. I wrote the brief and it was submitted on the briefs and not argued. The Court's decision was handed down on May 1, 2007.

Missouri Court of Appeals, Western District

Leu v. Dunkin et al. W.D. No. 56178. I represented the Appellant, Daren Leu, for injuries suffered at the hands of the drunken driver of a vehicle at a tractor pull. I wrote the entire brief and argued the appeal.

McClellion v. Kansas City Chiefs W.D. No. 73807. I represent the Appellant, Central McClellion in this appeal of a workers compensation award. The primary issue is the applicability of Sec. 287.270 R.S.Mo. in light of the NFL's Collective Bargaining Agreement and certain arbitration decisions construing the same. The matter was settled after submission but prior to a decision being handed down.

15. If you are serving or have served in a judicial capacity, describe the nature and extent of your judicial responsibilities, the types of dockets handled and any special expertise developed.

Since 2004 I have served as the Municipal Court Judge for the city of Peculiar, Missouri. During that time, I have disposed of thousands of cases (traffic, minor assaults, drug paraphernalia and ordinance violations) by plea and hundreds by trial. I instituted a housing court docket and during my tenure the number of cases disposed of is up by more than fifty percent (50)% and the revenue to the city is up significantly.

While I was the Secretary/Attorney for the Kansas City Board of Police Commissioners I served as a quasi-judicial officer in cases involving officer terminations with the Board sitting as the trier of fact. The hearings were conducted much as a civil trial is set up with me conducting the hearing, ruling on evidentiary matters and submitting the case to the Commissioners.

I have experience in mediations that is further outlined in response to question No. 11. Briefly, I initiated and oversaw a program whereby the Office of Community Complaints (OCC) and the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department worked through differences associated with recommendations for the discipline of police officers in cases investigated by OCC.

Finally, I have served as a condemnation commissioner in numerous matters, most recently for a matter involving the city of Blue Springs, Missouri and several parcels of property near the I-70 and Woods Chapel Road interchange.

The cases I presided over as the Secretary/Attorney for the Kansas City, Missouri Board of Police Commissioners were confidential hearings that I am constrained from providing specific information on. However, one case that was appealed and may be of note is **State ex rel. Rogers v. Board of Police Commissioners of Kansas City**, 995 S.W. 2d 1. (Mo.App.W.D.1999), wherein it was found that my appointment by the Board as the hearing officer in this matter was inappropriate and overturned.

Condemnation Cases

City of Blue Springs, Missouri v. ME LLC, et al. Case No. 1116-CV24258. The matter was resolved by Commissioner's Findings on March 14, 2012.

City of Grandview, Missouri v. Dunmire et al. Case No. 0916-CV26433. The matter was resolved by Commissioner's Findings on February 23, 2010.

Municipal Court Cases

I have handled thousands and tried hundreds of cases while serving as the Judge in Peculiar, Missouri involving charges ranging from traffic matters, assaults, ordinance violations, drug offenses and many others.

City of Peculiar v. Gary Rothlisberger (100+ Citations). Cases involved ordinance violations involving property code violations. The matters were tried, the Defendant was found guilty and he appealed his convictions to the Circuit Court of Cass County, Missouri where the matter was ultimately settled by the City and the Defendant. Notable for the number of charges and the more complex issues presented.
