Randolph Wilkins (Plaintiff) appeals the judgment of the Circuit Court of the City of St. Louis in favor of the Office of the Missouri Attorney General (OMAG) on his claim that the OMAG discriminated against him on the basis of age and disability in violation of the Missouri Human Rights Act (MHRA). Plaintiff asserts that the trial court abused its discretion in granting the OMAG's motion for a protective order and quashing the trial subpoena served on Missouri Attorney General Chris Koster.

AFFIRMED.

Division Four Holds: The trial court did not abuse its discretion in granting the protective order and quashing the trial subpoena served on Attorney General Koster because the OMAG demonstrated good cause to prohibit the trial subpoena of a top-level executive.
