Keith Jackson appeals from the trial court’s judgment dismissing his Federal Debt Collection Practices Act and Missouri Merchandising Practices Act claims against Dennis J. Barton, III, for failure to state a claim.

AFFIRMED

Division One holds: The trial court did not err in dismissing Jackson’s petition. Jackson’s FDCPA claim is barred by the one-year statute of limitations because the alleged violations of the Act were not discrete violations, but rather later effects of an earlier time-barred violation. Jackson’s MMPA claim fails because Barton’s alleged debt collection activities were not in connection with the underlying sale.
