Jean Leslie Guffey (“Claimant”) appeals from the decision of the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission (“the Commission”) finding Claimant was disqualified from receiving unemployment compensation. Claimant argues the Commission erred in determining she voluntarily terminated her employment because there was insufficient evidence to support the fact that Claimant voluntarily terminated her employment on December 4, 2008.

REVERSED AND REMANDED.

Division Two holds: There was not sufficient competent evidence in the record to support the Commission’s decision because the Appeals Tribunal failed to fully develop the allegations in the application for review as it was instructed.
