Joseph Williams ("Williams") appeals the trial court's judgment granting Colonel Jerry Lee's and Colonel James Keathley's (collectively, "Respondents") motion to dismiss, and ordering Williams to maintain registration in Missouri as a sex offender.

REVERSED AND REMANDED

Division Five Holds:

The trial court erred in granting Respondent's motion to dismiss because 42 U.S.C. section 16911(5)(C) exempts Williams from the duty to register as a sex offender. On remand, the trial court is directed to enter a finding that Williams is exempt from registering under 42 U.S.C. section 16911(5)(C), and to order Respondents to destroy all records pertaining to Williams's sex offender registration.
