Andrew Roberson appeals the judgment of the City of St. Louis, Judge Margaret M. Neill presiding. The Circuit Court denied Andrew Roberson post-conviction relief for ineffective assistance of trial counsel, determining that he failed to prove that trial counsel’s performance was deficient, or that he was prejudiced thereby.

AFFIRMED.

DIVISION ONE HOLDS: The Circuit Court did not err in denying Andrew Roberson’s Rule 29.15 motion to vacate his conviction for one count of first-degree murder and one count of armed criminal action based on Roberson’s claims alleging ineffective assistance of trial counsel. Because we find grounds for sustaining the trial court’s findings, the court’s judgment was not clearly erroneous and should be upheld. Therefore, we affirm.
