Edward Tramble (“Movant”) appeals from the judgment of the motion court denying his Rule 29.15 motion for post-conviction relief after an evidentiary hearing. Movant’s sole argument is that the motion court clearly erred in denying his Rule 29.15 motion for post-conviction relief because his trial counsel was ineffective for failing to protect Movant’s right to impeach Pastor Darries E. Rainey’s (“Pastor Rainey”) credibility with his prior robbery convictions while letting the State impeach Pastor Rainey’s credibility.

AFFIRMED.

Division Two Holds: The motion court did not clearly err in denying Movant’s Rule 29.15 motion for post-conviction relief because his trial counsel was not ineffective.
