Opinion Holds:

Eldon Bugg sought to have the judgment of the Honorable Deborah Daniels of the Boone County Circuit Court set aside on the ground that Judge Daniels exceeded her jurisdiction in finding Bugg in contempt of court for failing to pay an earlier judgment. The preliminary writ of prohibition is quashed.

Bugg cannot establish that there is no adequate remedy available to him by way of appeal. Although Bugg is out of time to file a timely notice of appeal, he still has sufficient time in which to seek a special order permitting a late filing of the notice of appeal, thus negating his need for an extraordinary writ.
