Following a jury trial, Terrill Reynolds appeals from his convictions for first degree robbery, armed criminal action, and unlawful possession of a firearm. Reynolds contends the circuit court erred in admitting into evidence screenshots of his cell phone call log over his hearsay objections.

AFFIRMED.

Division Four holds: Because the screenshots were computer-generated data logs of incoming and outgoing phone calls and were not statements made by a human declarant, they were not hearsay. Accordingly, the State was not required to show that the screenshots qualified under the business records exception to the hearsay rule. Thus, the circuit court did not err in admitting screenshots into evidence after the State demonstrated the reliability of the process involved in obtaining the phone logs. The convictions are affirmed.
