Descriptions of Column Headings:

Statute - The chapter and section of the Missouri Revised Statutes (RSMo) that relate to a particular charge code.

Type - The seriousness of a crime as determined by state statute (e.g. **Fel**= Felony, **Misd**= Misdemeanor, and **Infr**= Infraction).

Class - The classification of an offense as determined by statute: A, B, C, or D. It indicates the seriousness of the offense within a particular "Type".

Charge Code - The 5-digit charge code number assigned to a particular offense. The manual also lists a 2-digit NCIC modifier immediately following the 5-digit charge code and a one digit state modifier (0 - no modifier, 1 - attempt, 2 - accessory, and 3 - conspiracy) following the decimal point. The modifiers are used by prosecutors and law enforcement personnel to communicate additional information related to the offense charged in a particular case.

NCIC Code - National Crime Information Center assigns the first 2 digits; the last 2 digits should be selected by the officer from the list of modifiers

F/P OCN - Fingerprint / Offense Cycle Number: **Yes**= Fingerprints must be taken on a state criminal fingerprint (OCN) card and submitted to the Criminal Records and Identification Division of the MO State Highway Patrol. **Opt**=Optional to fingerprint. If fingerprints are sent to Criminal Records, the criminal charge will be added to criminal history. **No** = Fingerprints are not required. If fingerprints are sent to Criminal Records, the prints will be added to the AFIS data base but the charge/s will not be entered in criminal history

Literal Description - The charge code description that relates to a particular offense. The description is limited to 115-characters due to spacing issues.

THESE THREE COLUMNS ARE PRIMARILY FOR USE BY THE COURTS

Case Type - C=Conservation, F=Felony, J=Juvenile, M=Misdemeanor / Infraction, O=Ordinance, T=Traffic, W=Watercraft. "Case Type" is used by OSCA to categorize the various cases for management purposes.

ROC? - Record of Conviction: Indicates those cases that are reportable to the Department of Revenue.

Effective Date - Indicates the begin date for a charge code
