Additional Treatment Provider Information Assessment and Counseling Solutions

TREATMENT PHILOSOPHY

- 1. ACS strives to provide high quality, accessible and cost sensitive counseling services for clients experiencing substance use or co-occurring mental health problems.
- 2. Initial client contact is fielded by our administrative staff who have over two decades of experience in the field. Voicemails left by clients are returned on the same day as they are received. Assessments and Intakes are generally scheduled within five business days. Staff assist clients with documentation needed for state funding when they meet the criteria. At times during treatment, the clinical director will contact the state and advocate for additional funding given the clients circumstances. As treatment needs shift over time, alternative fee structures are offered when it would reduce monthly fees for the client. ACS clinical staff average is 25 years of experience as substance abuse counselors. This provides a high quality of service to clients day in and day out. Staff satisfaction and retention are high priorities at ACS.
 - Utilizing zoom for services has broadly increased accessibility for clients, many of whom lack a driver's license.
- **3.** Our target population is legal-involved clients with alcohol or other drugs being a primary factor.
- **4.** We are an abstinence-based program. We do support clients who are inclined to harm reduction through motivational interviewing and accept that clients will make their own decisions. We believe that helping clients objectively view the risks of their use will lead them to choosing abstinence or accepting consequences of future use. Either outcome moves them forward.

LEVEL OF CARE

- 1. Outpatient and intensive outpatient when needed.
- 2. Time, progress, compliance, team consensus. High risk high need determined by RANT and ORAS.
- 3. Yes, we require a minimum of one family session for alternative court participants.
- **4.** Prior to intake into the program probation utilizes the risks and needs triage. The Drivers Risk Inventory and the Addiction Risk Inventory are then applied.
- **5.** Hours of treatment per week. Intensity
- **6.** Intensive outpatient is 10 or more hours per week and outpatient is less than 10 hours per week.
- 7. We have no plans to provide other levels of care.

PROGRAM DESIGN AND TREATMENT INTERVENTIONS

- 1. For the purposes of this contract, the program is designed to integrate function and support the 10 key components of the Missouri Treatment Court standards.
- 2. Yes. Evidence based treatment comprises 90% of interventions. We currently utilize CBT, MI, and Moral Recognition Therapy.

- 3. We have a very experienced and diverse staff. This assists with identifying potential cultural needs and a nuanced manner of integrating them with generic treatment guidelines. The use of MI also helps to identify cultural tendencies throughout treatment.
- **4.** Client strengths are identified in the assessment process. Shame based statements during treatment are re-framed by staff toward the positive intent behind the behavior.
- 5. Yes. LPC, SQP, CRADC (and similar).
- 6. 90 days formally/1-2x monthly in staffing with treatment court team.
- **7.** Yes. All clients are screened during intake with the ASI. When indicated Beck anxiety and depression screenings are used as well as the DSM-V.
- 8. MRT was added several years ago.
- **9.** ARCA (Assisted Recovery Centers of America) is the only formal partnership; we have been referring clients to them for MAT and psychiatric services for over 10 years. We have numerous informal partnerships in the community.
- 10. Moral Recognition Therapy. Matrix (RP)
- 11. 90% of our clients are justice involved. We have been in business for 22 years.

PROGRAM OPERATIONS

- **1.** We offer it but for the purposes of this contract all program participants use Averhealth in this region.
- 2. N/A- Treatment Court clients all go to Averhealth.
- 3. We do case management informally. No dedicated case management employees.
- **4.** Yes, we have established relationships in the community to assist clients with resourcing support not provided by ACS.
- 5. Yes, we have a written grievance policy and procedure. This is provided to clients at intake as part of our informed consent.
- **6.** All documentation required to maintain certification by the state of Missouri Department of Behavioral Health. No electronic files.
- 7. Go to the nearest emergency room or call 988.
- 8. Yes. Cash accounting method. Contracted accounting services with Maixner CPA's.
- 9. Organizational chart attached.
- 10. When needed, ACS supports client efforts to secure insurance coverage.
- 11. Yes. Offender, DWI.
- **12.** No, ACS does not provide transportation services. We support clients' needs through assisting them with resourcing transportation.
- 13. Analog.
- 14. N/A

STAFF CHARACTERISTICS AND QUALIFICATIONS

- **1.** ACS staff is diverse in both experiences and characteristics. Open-mindedness is emphasized and allows continuous growth in cultural competency.
- 2. Staff experiences and styles are considered when individual counselors are assigned, based on client needs.
- 3. Yes, given our population.

- 4. Yes. The clinical director addresses client concerns within 48 hours and adjusts as appropriate. Client feedback surveys at discharge have been overwhelmingly positive. These also provide ACS with real-time feedback about how well we are doing as well as potential areas of growth.
- 5. All staff are primarily substance use oriented and two LPC's can address co-occurring issues. Staff averages over 25 years of experience working with legal referred substance use clients. Three staff have approximately 30 years of experience working directly and primarily with alternative courts.
- 6. Yes.
- **7.** Ongoing 40 hours every 2 years. Staff have from 15-35 years' counseling experience with offenders, our target population.
- **8.** Yes, ACS supports staff self-care with liberal PTO practices. Self-care, self-reflection and self-improvement are the lifestyles of our staff as evidenced by their ability to survive and thrive over time in a very challenging field.
- **9.** Yes, they do model what they teach and attend to health issues when needed. Staff wellness practices are evidenced by very few sick days.

INSURANCE AND MEDICAID

- 1. If requested.
- 2. Yes, we refer to ARCA whom we have an MOU with.
- 3. Staff support clients with resourcing coverage when appropriate.
- **4.** Only for 1:1 counseling.
- 5. We are not eligible to receive payment from Medicaid.
- 6. N/A
- **7.** N/A

OUALITY ASSURANCE MECHANISM

- Client requests, suggestions or concerns are brought to the Clinical Director. Consultation, collaboration and further conversations with clients are options prior to decision making.
 Client feedback surveys are requested by ACS and reviewed quarterly by the Clinical Director.
- 2. Yes, clinical supervision is an ongoing process by the Clinical Director as needed. Formal clinical supervision for SATOP qualifications can be provided by John Burns, CRADAC, SQP-R, ICADC. Formal clinical supervision if LPC's is not done at this time.
- 3. Certification for treatment by Missouri Division of Behavioral Health, fire/safety inspections, local business license, ADA compliance confidentiality compliance (42CFR).
- **4.** Yes, ACS has formal policy and procedures and formal operational guidelines. These are fluid and subject to modification, they are formally reviewed annually.
- 5. Yes, the Missouri Department of Mental Health does an intensive review for re-certification every three years. MO DMH does an annual safety and basic assurances review as well as a billing review annually. All these reviews have been transitioning to virtual so it's unknown if future reviews will be onsite.
- **6.** We are a small organization so there is continuous feedback between staff and the Clinical Director regarding how we operate.

PROGRAM EVALUATION

- 1. All participants are provided with a feedback survey and encouraged to submit post-treatment, anonymously if desired. This contains objective measures of initial contact, assessment process, group counseling, individual counseling, overall experience and any comments. We receive about 100 per quarter. All are reviewed by the Clinical Director and quarterly summaries are compiled. Reinforcement or adjustments are potential outcomes.
- 2. We are happy to share evaluations and summaries with the court.
- 3. Organizational evaluations are required by MO DMH, their content is not specified. DMH does expect annual goals and annual evaluation of progress.
- 4. See #3, above.
- 5. See #1, above. Results have been overwhelmingly positive.
- 6. We are not maintaining electronic records currently.
- **7.** Surveys have fourteen quantitative prompts: 1-5 ratings. Lines for explanations and additional comments provide qualitative data.
- 8. If required. No experience.

COMPETENCIES THE PROVIDER MUST HAVE OR MUST BE WILLING TO DEVELOP

- **1.** All treatment begins with a baseline duration. This is commonly adjusted based on numerous factors.
- 2. Meeting clients where they are is a cornerstone of our philosophy. MI is a baseline in our treatment.
- 3. ACS has had two staff as active members of a court team for the past four years.
- 4. Yes, most of our clients are court ordered, and justice involved.
- **5.** We do not formally use contingency management. MI, CBT and strength-based approaches mirror that system.
- 6. Services are driven by time as well as clinical and medical need.
- 7. We have always communicated treatment progress with probation and parole as well as the court team. Clients must sign consent forms allowing us to do this.
- **8.** Modifications to interventions and modalities occur through collaboration, consultation and continuing education by all staff.

MEDICATION ASSISSTED TREATMENT (MAT)

- **1.** ACS supports MAT approaches to recovery.
- 2. Habitual relapses and chronic daily use open the discussion of MAT with clients.
- 3. ACS outsources MAT.
- 4. ACS has an MOU with ARCA.
- **5.** Consents signed by clients allow communication between ACS and ARCA regarding client participation, compliance and effectiveness.
- **6.** Currently Vivitrol, Suboxone and Revia are the primary medications. Zofran, Topamax and Antabuse are also available.
 - **A.** ARCA has offered those medications since they have been available, they are a leader in our area.
 - **B.** Currently three participants are using MAT.

- **7.** ACS protocols are the same for MAT and other prescriptions. Follow up about compliance, side-effects, and effectiveness. We trust the prescribers to manage medications. We support client experience and self-advocacy.
- **8.** No, that is beyond our area of expertise.
- 9. The same psychosocial treatments as all clients, primarily CBT, MI, and MRT.
- **10.** All of our services are available for MAT recipients.
- **11.** Funding for MAT is though the provider. Private insurance and grant money are potential sources with ARCA.
- **12.** Yes
- **13.** No
- **14.** Staff has had various MAT trainings.







- 1. By signing and submitting this proposal, the prospective recipient of Federal assistance funds is providing the certification as set out below.
- 2. The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was entered into. If it is later determined that the prospective recipient of Federal assistance funds knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal Government, the Department of Labor (DOL) may pursue available remedies, including suspension and/or debarment.
- 3. The prospective recipient of Federal assistance funds shall provide immediate written notice to the person to whom this proposal is submitted if at any time the prospective recipient of Federal assistance funds learns that its certification was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.
